ISCED-97 level 0: Pre-primary education is defined as the initial stage of organised instruction, designed primarily to introduce very young children to a school type environment; should be centre or school-based, be designed to meet the educational and developmental needs of children at least 3 years old and not older than 6.

This education may also be provided in hospitals or in special schools or training centres. 4871-4872

ISCED-97 level 1: Primary education usually begins at age 5, 6 or 7 and generally lasts for 4 to 6 years. Programmes are normally designed to give students a sound basic education in reading, writing and mathematics along with an elementary understanding of other subjects. Organised instruction for children with special needs should also be included. Literacy or basic skills programmes within or outside the school system which are similar in content to programme in primary education. 4881

ISCED-97 levels 2 and 3: lower-secondary and upper-secondary education.

- out-of-school secondary education for adults and young people 4891-4896

ISCED-97 level 4: It was introduced to cover programmes that straddle the boundary between upper secondary and post-secondary education.

Programmes on this level typically have a full-time equivalent duration between 6 months and 2 years. The typical entry requirement is successful completion of ISCED-97 level 3. Programmes designed to provide direct access to ISCED-97 level 5A.

Type 5A: programmes that are theoretically based and/or preparatory to research (history, philosophy, mathematics, etc.) or give access to professions with high skill requirements, such as medicine, dentistry, and architecture. Programmes designed to provide direct access to ISCED-97 level 5B. Type 5B: programmes that are practically oriented/occupationally specific and are mainly designed for participants to acquire the practical skills and know how needed for employment in a particular occupation or trade, the successful completion of which usually culminates in a qualification relevant for the labour market. ISCED-97 level 5b does not give access to ISCED-97 level 6. Programmes primarily designed for direct access to the labour market, although they also provide access to other ISCED-97 level 4 programmes".

4901

ISCED-97 levels 5 and 6: first stage and second stage of tertiary education.

4911-4912

Educational programmes, generally for adults, which do not require any special prior instruction, in particular vocational training or cultural development.

4921-4925
