

The Findex usually surveys around 1,000 observations per country (with some exceptions). Given this sample size, it is suggested that any analysis should be based off at least 10% of the sample size (100 observations). Sometimes double splicing the data, for example the share of adults who receive pension and are also women can reduce the observed sample to fewer than a hundred observations.
