

Indonesia 2003 PETS/QSDS Data Use Guide

Using the Indonesia PETS/QSDS Data Set

Introduction

It was believed that the economic crisis in Indonesia had a great effect on the education sector so a PETS was undertaken to collect information on the extent of the effect. The 1998 study reveals that parents and children are feeling the effect of the crisis one year into the economic downturn. A follow-up survey was also done in 2000 because the economic crisis persisted. In general, it revealed an increase in total funding during the crisis years at both primary and junior secondary levels, even if these increases did not keep pace with inflation. As a result, the crisis had very little impact on basic education enrollment.

Using the Indonesian Data Files

The Indonesian data set is composed of one instrument that combines data from two visits. The file covers surveys from two visits of the Teachers in Indonesia.

In order to merge files, a unique identifier was created. The indoschoolsurvey data file uses “schoolid” as the unique identifier.

The data files (raw and corrected) are provided in Stata10 © format. Other available files include the survey questionnaire, a codebook for each data file and the correction do-file applied to each data file.
