A. INTRODUCTION

The Government of Indonesia is launching the first year of the Program Nasional Pemberdayaan Masyarakat (PNPM) in mid-2007. The PNPM will be an extension of the current Kecamatan Development Program (KDP) implemented in three phases since 1998, and the Urban Poverty Program, implemented in three phases since 2000. PNPM will extend the approach of KDP in rural kecamatan and the Urban Poverty Project (UPP) in urban kecamatan. There will be a period of socialization and community organization assists communities to engage in a participatory planning and decision-making process to allocate resources provided by the program in the form of block grants for their self-defined development needs and priorities. Year 1 implementation will occur in all kecamatan participating in the first phase of KDP (KDP1), the second phase of KDP (KDP2) and UPP. In addition, approximately 500 additional rural kecamatan, previously not participating in KDP will begin PNPM in 2007. A second year for PNPM (PNPM2) will begin in 2008, and a third year (PNPM3) in 2009 will cover remaining kecamatans. By the end of 2009, all kecamatan in Indonesia will be participating in the program.

The program's primary objectives are in concert with Indonesia's development priorities and the Millennium Development Goals:

- To reduce poverty
- To increase access to services
- To increase employment
- To improve social dynamics and demand for good governance within the community

The Kecamatan Development Program (KDP) is a national Government of Indonesia program aimed at alleviating poverty, strengthening local government and community institutions, and improving local governance. Beginning implementation in 1998 focusing on Indonesia's poorest rural communities, KDP is in its third and final phase. PNPM will continue to implement the KDP approach in the existing 1993 KDP kecamatans, and extend the approach to all rural kecamatan in Indonesia by the end of 2009. KDP provides block grants of approximately Rp 500 million to 1.5 billion (approximately USD 50,000 to USD 150,000) to sub-districts (kecamatan) depending upon population size. Each cycle of block grant disbursement and sub-project implementation lasts approximately 8-9 months in Java, and slightly longer in outside Java. Communities are eligible to receive grants in all cycles.

Villages compete for the kecamatan block grant resources by developing and submitting sub-project proposals. To assist in preparing the proposals, villagers elect village facilitators (one man, one woman) who assist with the socialization and planning process. The facilitators hold group meetings, including separate women's meetings, to discuss the needs of the village and their development priorities. Villagers make their own choices about the kinds of development projects they wish to fund from an open menu.

Communities meet at the village and sub-district levels to decide which proposals should be funded. Meetings are open to all community members to attend and propose projects. An inter-village forum composed of elected village representatives makes the final decisions on project funding. Project menus are open to all productive investments except for those on a short negative list. Once resources are allocated, KDP maintains social and technical consultants at the kecamatan and district levels to assist with socialization, planning, and implementation. KDP community forums select members to be part of an implementation team to manage the projects. KDP technical facilitators help the village implementation team with infrastructure design, project budgeting, quality verification, and supervision..

An impact evaluation survey was designed by the World Bank to evaluate the KDP program in achieving the core objectives set by the government of Indonesia listed above. This report presents the result of the Impact Evaluation Survey of KDP conducted by SurveyMETER from the first week of February to April 2010.

This report is limited to all activities related to the preparation, the execution and the processing of the data for the PNPM-KDP Impact Evaluation 2010 survey only.

B. RESEARCH DESIGN

Two evaluation surveys are designed to rigorously evaluate the core priorities of the Government of Indonesia outlined above: poverty, employment, social capital and access to services. The first survey, the PNPM-KDP Impact Evaluation 2007 Survey, or Survey Evaluasi Dampak PNPM-KDP (SEDAP07) was fielded in 2007, just prior to the first year of implementation of PNPM. It served as both as a baseline for PNPM and a post-completion survey for KDP. A second survey, the follow up for PNPM was conducted in early 2010. Both surveys use a sample of identified households selected from the 2002 SUSENAS national household survey with the goal of creating a household panel by surveying the same households again in 2007 and 2010. The SUSENAS core was the primary instrument. In addition, the evaluation will employ a short module focusing on social capital and governance. Each survey covered 456 kecamatans and approximately 9505 households in provinces across Indonesia listed below. The survey consisted of interviews with household heads and spouses.

The evaluation will address the following research questions:

The overall objective of the two surveys is to evaluate the impact and effectiveness of PNPM and KDP. The objective of this 2010 survey is to provide a second round of data for PNPM and a third round of data for KDP, specifically:

- To identify specific households selected for the sample from the 2002 national household survey (SUSENAS) and interviewed in the 2007 survey.
- To collect data from these households in PNPM-KDP targeted kecamatan, and a non-targeted kecamatan

SEDAP survey was originally cover 456 kecamatans but due to expansion and restructure of the unit of local government in 2010 SEDAP cover 544 kecamatan in the following provinces: Sumatra Barat, Sumatra Utara, Sumatra Selatan, Jambi, Lampung, Riau, Banten, Bali DKI Yogyakarta, Jawa Timur, Jawa Tengah, Jawa Barat, Bali, Nusa Tenggara Barat, Kalimantan Selatan, Sulawesi Selatan, Sulawesi Tenggara, Sulawesi Utara.

In the case that a household is not found in the original 2007 location, effort is made to track the household for movers not only within kecamatan but also track those who move out side Kecamatan. In the case of split off household, interview of the household was done where the 2007 head of the household resides. This tracking procedure made 152 households located in 137 Kecamatan outside kecamatan SUSENAS/SEDAP 2002/2007.

The SEDAP 2007 is targeted to interview a total of 10,032 households. Each kecamatan contains two BPS census blocks (enumeration area) of maximum 11 households. All 2007 households were sampled, making a total target household of maximum 22 households per kecamatan. Total response rate 2007 SEDAP is 94.6. Un interviewed household mainly due to: (1) households or household heads moved out side desa that were not tracked and (2) there are a number of SUSENAS 2002 households that were not known and verification of these households were difficult due to un-availability of information on the name of the household members and incomplete address information.

The household target SEDAP 2010 are households completed and partially completed interviewed in 2007 which is 9506 households. In 2007 there are 912 target EAs but 10 EAs were dropped due to very remote area and bad weather. In 2010 only 902 EA were visited. The number of kecamatan, census block/desa/EA, SEDAP 2007 household, and SEDAP 2010 households per province is outlined in Table 1.

C. RESPONSE RATE

As provided in Table 2, total response rate 2010 SEDAP is 97.42. In five provinces, the teams were able to interview more than 99% of targeted households, included Sumatera Barat, Sumatera Selatan, Lampung, Banten and Bali. The completion rate of above average rate, 97.7 – 98.8% was obtained by eight provinces: Sumatera Utara, Riau, Jambi, West Java, Central Java, D.I Yogyakarta, East Java and West Nusa Tenggara.

Kalimantan Selatan, Sulawesi Utara and Sulawesi Selatan were three provinces with completion rate of 97.1 – 97.2 %. Only one province where completion rate was below 90% that is Southeast Sulawesi (66.7%).

Several conditions were contributed to completion rate of less than 100% of targeted household (Table 3a and 3b):

1. All household members in the household died mainly due to only one person live in the house and already very old. There are 46 households which is about 0.48% of interviewed households
2. Household merge to other SEDAP 2010 household and no other household members left, 6 households (0.06%)
3. Households refused but the number is very small, only 3 households (0.03).
4. Households unable contacted in main survey and in the period of revisit and tracking. Only 0.04 % of the cases(4 households)
5. Tracking is a challenge in panel survey especially in the spread out area like SEDAP. SEDAP 2010 also tracked mover (household head) move out side kecamatan to SEDAP province and Jakarta and Aceh. Not all tracking households could be tracked due to incomplete address, the tracking targets were not in address mentioned by informants in origin location such as they moved again or the addresses are incorrect. The details are as follows: there are 16 households where the address mentioned in tracking form could not be found and in-complete address, 17 households have been revisit but could not get complete address. In addition 32 household could not be interviewed due to unknown address. There are 22 households moved out side SEDAP province, Nangroe Aceh Darusalam and Jakarta
6. The low completion rate of Sulawesi Tenggara because there are 80 households from 2007 survey with incorrect/fictive data. Sulawesi Tenggara has total of 24 enumeration areas which are located in 6 kabupaten, 12 kecamatan and 264 households. There are four kecamatan in which all the households in those kecamatan are fictive. Those kecamatan are Wangi-wangi, Kabaena Timur, Tongkuno and Asera in which EA 889-894 and 909,910 are located. In addition there is an other one fictive households which are located out side those kecamatan. Therefore the total fictive households in Sulawesi Tenggara are 87 households. We discovered this problem, when we revisit household in the location mentioned in 2007, but nobody know about these households. We asked the Supervisor and he admitted that the team never visited those households in 2007.

7. Same as SEDAP 2007, SEDAP 2010 only interviewed a household where household head of previous round survey resided. Given this rule, even though some members of the household still live in the desa and household head moved outside kecamatan with unknown address we were not permitted to interview the household member who still live in the desa. If we were allowed to interview the household member who still live in desa the completion rate could be higher.

D. TRACKING

The 2007 SEDAP has complete address of the households including street name, village, location note, phone number, route and map. The 2010 household address was pre-printed. In order to make sure that we will locate the right household we used additional individual information such as age, gender, relation to household head, marital status, field of work, occupation and status of work.

We tracked household if a household or head of household moved. Tracking is an important aspect of a panel study. Unlike in 2007 which only tracked household head who move in the same desa, in 2010 we tracked household head wherever they move as long as they move into the same SEDAP province or to Nangroe Aceh Darusalam and Jakarta. Information on address at the destination, place of work and the school name of household members were collected from an informant at the origin location to trace the where about of the household. All these information were recorded in a tracking form.

As presented in Table 2, 9266 households were interviewed and the other 2 households were partially interviewed in 2010. Among completed interview and partially interviewed households 96.89% of the 2010 households interviewed in their location in 2007, 1.06% moved and interviewed in the same desa, 0.44% moved and interviewed in the same kecamatan and 1.64% moved and interviewed out- side kecamatan (Table 4). Several households who moved out-side kecamatan, moved cross kabupaten and province, such as people from Sumatera Utara moved to Aceh and interviewed in Aceh, from Jawa Barat moved and interview in Jakarta. The 152 households moved out side kecamatan are interviewed in 137 different kecamatan. Table 5 present the kabupaten destination of the mover out side kecamatan which completed interviewed.

The cost and time required for tracking is higher than normal interview in original location mainly due to longer distance which require longer travel time and cost. In addition locating new address of the mover also require more time than locating household in their original location. Box 1 presents one story on how tracking was done.

Box 1.
Tracking a Mover from Jambi to a Plantation in Riau

Route of the journey to new location: 1. Pekanbaru – Pelabuhan Tembilahan; 2. Tembilahan Harbour - Guntung River; 3. Guntung River – Sakal Pasir Port; 4. Sakal Pasir Port – Plantation 19; 5. plantation 19 – Kempas Estate;

Tracking Story

In form tracking address, informant of the household suggested interviewer to contact respondent first before going to respondent's house because respondent only has spare time on holiday. From the initial contact, we learned that respondent's holiday is on Friday.

Based on the schedule promised by respondent, Fajar (the tracking interviewer) went to Tembilahan Harbour on Thursday at 21.00 from Pekan Baru. He thought that he would arrive at Tembilahan on Friday morning and then he could continue his travel to Guntung by speedboat.

At 04.30 a.m in the morning, Fajar arrived at Tembilahan harbor which was located behind the Great Mosque of Tembilahan and he came by to that mosque to pray and take a rest. He also looked for information about the speedboat heading to Guntung River. Coincidentally, there was a traveler named Mr. Kahar who wanted to go to Batam by speedboat and asked Fajar to come with him because his boat usually came by to Guntung River.

Fajar went to the harbor with Mr. Kahar and bought a speedboat ticket to Guntung. The ticket itself was very expensive because it was a 3 hours voyage from Tembilahan, and speedboat needs a lot of fuel to get there. The boat left at 09.00 AM and it was the only boat on schedule that day. If only Fajar was late to catch that boat, he must have to wait for the next boat on the following day.

The speedboat crossed the river of Batangtuaka and some narrow straits and finally arrived at Guntung River at 13.10 PM As the distance from harbor Guntung to Harbor Sakal Pasir was quiet long, interviewer must take another speedboat which took about 10 minutes to reach Sakal Pasir harbor. This speedboat also had only one schedule in a day. Interviewer went there at half past one in the afternoon and reached Guntung river harbor after one hour voyage.

The speedboat from Sakal Pasir departed at about 2 PM from Sungai Guntung, and the voyage from Sungai Guntung to Sakal Pasir harbour took about an hour. From Sakal Pasir, interviewer must walk before he could take another speedboat to plantation 19 which took about 1 hour and passing through the tranquil area of palm oil plantation. Speedboat with destination to plantation 19 also has only one schedule in a day, so if one missed the boat, one have to wait for the next boat on the following day. After Fajar reached plantation 19, he changed another speedboat to Kempas Estate that took an hour. The boat also has only one schedule in a day.

After he reached Kempas Estate which is located in the middle of an island full of palm oil plantation, Fajar had to report himself to the security Base I in front of the PT TH Indo Plantation office and he had to explain his intention for coming to that place. After he explained to the security that he was looking for a man named Saat, the security mentioned that there were three men named Saat. The first one is Saat Lombok who works as Supervisor, the second is Saat Pancung as the speedboat driver, and the third is Saat as the employee. The security was unfamiliar with the third Saat since the employee has working there for only a year.

After Fajar mentioned Saat from Jambi, the security asked one of his friends and luckily he knew him and finally allowed Fajar to enter the gate number 4, next to the mosque. As he also asked permission to stay with Mr Saat for a night, as it was impossible for him to go home that day, he had to give away his ID card.

After he was allowed get in, Fajar finally found Mr Saat from Jambi that he was looking for. And after took sometimes to have a rest, Fajar asked Mr. Saat to have an interview and he was willing to be interviewed. When the interview has completed, Fajar asked Mr. Saat about the way back from Kempas Estate to Guntung river. According to Mr Saat information, the transportation to Sungai Guntung is only by speedboat 06.00 in the morning. He can get the boat in front of the security office, and there is no other boat in that day.

In the next morning, Fajar woke up at 04.30 and waited for the praying time. After he prayed, he packed up and continues his voyage to Guntung river and then he went to Perigi Raja. At 05.45, while he waited for the boat to 19 in front of the security office, Fajar saw the workers of PT TH indo Plantation gathering and dividing the working area. He also had conversation with the security concerning the condition of that factory. He found out that the workers of that plantation were from many places throughout Indonesia. Time flied and not even a boat passed him. Then he became anxious and he worried if he has to spend another day in that place if there was no boat that day.

The clock pointed at 09.00 AM, but the boat has not shown up yet. The security said that if the boat did not show up at the time like that, the possibility was there is no passenger from 19. He also said that it is difficult to get speedboat to get the lower areas as Kempas is on the highest area. Luckily, there was information that there was a pancung (sort of boat) heading to A2, nearby Sakal Pasir to take palm oil poison. Since the boat has the same way to my destination, he got on that boat and hoped that the speedboat destination to Sakal Pasir had not gone. Fajar inquired the driver about the approximate time to reach Sakal Pasir. He estimated that they would reach there by three hours and he also guessed that there would still be speedboat in Sakal Pasir. Fajar was a little bit late to get Sakal Pasir because as he had to round to Mahoni Estate first. However, the boat he was on had been removed to the other river heading to Sakal Pasir as the other river had been blocked.

He reached Sakal Pasir at 10.40 and he paid the boat before he get off the boat. How ever when he went to the locket to buy a ticket to Guntung river, he found out that the speedboat had just gone and there would be another speedboat on the next day. Lucky for him as he met an employee of the palm oil factory who knew that the general manager wanted to go to Guntung by speedboat at 11.00 a.m and he decided to take that chance. Fajar asked permission to the security and he waited the speedboat until 12.45 p.m because the general manager had a meeting. The voyage to Guntung took about 45 minutes by speedboat. He reached there at 13.30 and he missed the speedboat to Perigi Raja. Thus, he stayed a night in Guntung and he had to continue his way back to Perigi Raja on the next day

Generally there are some interviewers who needed more than one day to find 1 respondent because the places were in remote area and needed particular transportation such as ojek, speedboat, and travel.

Not all movers can be found and interviewed in their new location. There are 87 households who moved and could not be interviewed in their new location, mainly due to incomplete address information (49 cases). In the case of incomplete address, the team revisited the original location of the EA and collected additional information on mover address. However we could not have additional information on address of the mover for all households. The other reasons are head of households moved outside SEDAP provinces or outside Indonesia (22 cases), HH tracked and not found (16 cases). Table 6 presents summary notes on reasons on why households moved could not interviewed

E. FLAG OF INCORRECT DATA

During field work 2010 we discovered that there are incorrect 2007 data. These are mainly due to either 2007 data is fictive or 2007 interviewers interviewed wrong households. The detail notes for each HHID are presented in Appendix B. We didn't delete the data, neither in 2007 data nor in 2010 data but we created a flag variable to indicate this error. The flag variable included in the re-release 2007 data, 2010 data and the merging 2007 & 2010 data. In data the label of the flag variable is "flag of incorrect data" with the following four values:

1. Flag 1= 2002, 2007 and 2010 data correct
2. Flag 2= 2007 and 2010 data correct
3. Flag 3= 2002 data correct, 2007 data fictive and not interviewed in 2010
4. Flag 4=2002, 2010 data correct but 2007 data incorrect

The total number incorrect 2007 data is 113 households (1.19%). Table 7 presents the distribution of this flag by province. Most of the errors occur in Southeast Sulawesi follow by South Sulawesi, Lampung, South Sumatera and North Sumatera. The number incorrect 2007 household data in Southeast Sulawesi is 86 (32.5% total household in Southeast Sulawesi), in South Sulawesi is 20 (1.5% total household in South Sulawesi), in Lampung 4 households (0.67% total household in Lampung), South Sumatera 2 households (0.53% total household in South Sumatera), in North Sumatera is 1 household (0.07% total household in North Sumatera). The distribution of flag by kecamatan presents in Table 8. The error is distributed in 17 kecamatan.

F. SURVEY INSTRUMENTS

Questionnaire SEDAP 2010 is mostly the same as SEDAP 2007 which mainly drawn from both SUSENAS 2002 household (not including sections III and VIII) and individual core questionnaire (not including sections VB and VE). In addition new modules on social capital and governance were also included at 2007 round. Household heads/spouses/other household members age 18 and above are the main respondent of household information modules and social capital and governance modules. At the individual level all household members answered individual level modules of the SUSENAS core questions.

Table 9 summarizes the structure of the questionnaire which was divided into three books and subdivided within book into blocks/sections. Two books of the questionnaire, Book RT and book MSP, collected information at the household level. Book INDIVIDU collected individual level data from all household members. The following section described the content of each book and block/section.

Book RT: Household Location, Roster, Housing and Consumption. This book was answered by household heads/spouses/other household members age 18 and above. The first block of the book provides sample identification and followed by household characteristics including ethnic group. Household roster in third block records basic demographic characteristics of all household members (including, name, relation to household head, sex, age and marital status). Information on housing characteristics, including size, construction material, source of drinking water, type of toilet facility etc are collected in the fourth block while the fifth and sixth blocks records consumption data. The consumption module listed the value of food consumed from purchase, self-produced and gift in the last one week as well as value of non food consumed from purchase, self-produced and gift during the last one month and the last one year. This book is also used to record information that may be used to locate the household in next round of survey. At the end of each book an interviewer's evaluation/note blocks is provided to record additional related information that can not be captured in the standard questions in the questionnaire.

Book MSP: Social Capital and Governance. Household heads/spouses/other household members age 18 and above are the main respondent of this book. This book contains of six sections. The first section records information on collective action and cooperation, including frequency of working together for collective, communal needs; fraction of the community contributing money, labor or material and the changes over time and mechanisms for problem solving in the village. The next section records information on communal trust such as trust among villagers, trust towards government and the changes over time and access to public services. Information and communication section is in the third block. This section records information on source of information about community development planning and utilization of funds for development projects. Section on empowerment, governance and political action in the fourth block collects information on frequency of public meetings in the village, level of meetings, who participates, purpose

of the meeting, and involvement of respondent during the meeting. This section also asks willingness of respondent to express dissatisfaction about village governance, the channel through which respondent expressed this dissatisfaction what is the government's reaction. Poverty perception including characteristics of poor households, and perception of respondent about causes of poverty and the way out of poverty are recorded in the fourth block. Finally the last block asks about knowledge on KDP program.

Book INDIVIDU: Individual Information. All household members answer book INDIVIDU. The first block of book INDIVIDU asks health of household member including morbidities, self-treatment, outpatients and inpatient utilization. Education information collected in the second block includes level of school attended and the grade. In the last block are information on employment including information on activities last week, hours, days, field, occupation, status of work and income and respondent's participation in KDP project and income obtain from the project

G. SURVEY OPERATION

1. Pilot Test of Tracking Procedure

The SEDAP 2009 used the same questionnaire as SEDAP 2007 therefore there was no pilot for testing questionnaire but we did one pilot for tracking procedure. We consider tracking is one the key success of the study therefore pilot testing of tracking procedure is very important .We tracked movers in the same kecamatan and outside kecamatan. The purpose of the pilot test is to identify and developed tracking procedure to maximize re-contact rate.

In order to carry out an efficient pilot test and revision of the questionnaire we need to consider the following:

1. The location of the pilot test: the choice of the location is important, because for a tracking pilot test to be effective it was conducted in SEDAP 2007 location in Jawa Tengah
2. The staff: choice of staff that carries out the field test is also crucial. They should be experienced field staff that can administer the questionnaire and be able to give feed back and suggestions on how to improve the questions.
3. Coordination and communication with the principal investigator: a constant coordination and communication with the principal investigator should be maintained through out the period of the field test, so that problems encountered in the field could be communicated and suggestions for revision of tracking procedure and question(s) could be done more efficient and without deviating from the purpose of the question(s).

Based on the above considerations the following field plan for the pilot-test and revision of the questionnaire was conducted:

1. Location of pilot test: the pilot-test locations were in SEDAP 2007 enumeration. The proposed location and its characteristic are presented in Table 10 below.
2. The team: two teams of two interviewers were recruited for the pilot test. They are all experienced field staff ex IFLS, Wise, STAR, and SEDAP 2007 and have also been involved in pilot and pre-testing of questionnaire in our previous studies. These for core staff along side with the survey director and assistant survey director were involved in revision of the questionnaire and procedure.
3. Field test organization: considering that we have one pilot that is testing the tracking procedure. Meeting with the Bank survey supervisors were done in

between the two pilot tests to review the outcome of the pilot-test and if necessary suggest changes in the questions and tracking procedure.

For testing the tracking procedure, each interviewer assigned a number of SEDAP 2007 households to be relocated. Considering that the pilot carried in SEDAP 2007 desa and in order not contaminating the prospective sample we only identified household location and verified household members using short roster. In the first pilot the team tested tracking procedure. Each interviewer was targeted to relocate 5 to 6, SEDAP 2007 households.

2. Field Staff and Supervisory Structure

Based on the information on the number of kecamatan and the number of sample of households to be interviewed, in each province there are 1 - 7 small teams who were doing data collection, depending on the number of kecamatan and the number of households selected in each province. Each province coordinated and supervised by experienced field coordinators. Since some provinces have a small number of selected kecamatan we combined some of these provinces as follows.

- D.I. Yogyakarta with Jawa Tengah
- NTB with Bali.
- Banten with Jawa Barat

Each small team in a province was supervised by supervisor who also acts as an editor CAFE. Every team has two enumerators.

In general each SEDAP 2007 kecamatan consist of two desa with 11 households per desa to be interviewed, hence the team moved from kecamatan to kecamatan within six days.

Data entry was done in the field by Café editor using a laptop with pre-designed program. The Café system proved to be effective in keeping checks for errors and allowing correction of errors to be done by interviewer in the field thereby maintaining high quality of data. The completed data entry sent to Yogyakarta at least once a week. This enabled the central office to monitor the progress and the performance of the teams.

A supervisor in this study is very mobile and fully occupied. He is assigned to lead the team in to the enumerated area by contacting the village staff and introducing the team to the respective head of the desa, obtaining permission and identifying the location of the households conducted in advance. He also located and choose a reasonable base camp for the team. Considering the short period a team stayed in a desa, a supervisor had very little time to supervise and maintaining the quality of the data collected by his team. For this purpose we have field coordinators who moved from one team to another to conduct verification, observation and random checking of the completed questionnaires.

Every enumerator should have a constant communication with the café editors/Café supervisor. His/her completed questionnaire edited by the café editor and any errors communicated to him/her via an MIS form that listed the errors.

3. Interviewers Selection and Training

Café Supervisors and field coordinators were recruited in Yogyakarta and were drawn mostly from ex IFLS, Wise and STAR field staff. They were recruited in advance to participate in the training of trainers 20-23 of January 2010 and assisted the trainers in the training of field staff. The local supervisor and interviewers were recruited from each of the respective province, particularly for provinces outside Java.

Training of field staff was conducted in one batch in three parallel classes with subjects thought by the same trainers. The training conducted in Solo, 25- 30 of January 2010. The core staffs (survey director, assistant survey director and some of the field coordinators) were the major trainers.

Six days of training was required, consist of three days in class training, two days of field practice and one day review. The training method was a combination of formal class room teaching of the content of the questionnaire, a discussion, demonstration and role playing. In addition live respondents were invited to give participants a chance to have direct contact with the real respondent. At the end of the in class training, a field practice was organized. This is a simulation of the actual field plan in which all the field procedure will be implemented. We have trained more than the number of field staff required allowing us to select the best quality of field staff.

4. Field Work

The main field activities were conducted from 2 February, 2010 until March 20, 2010. The revisit and tracking were done with smaller number of team from March 21 to April 24, 2010. In total there were 61 small teams. Each team consist of two interviewers and one supervisor who also CAFE editors, therefore there were a total of 122 interviewers, 61 supervisors/Café editors. Every 6-8 teams were coordinated by one field coordinators. The number of team per province is listed in Table 11.

5. Data Entry

Data entry was done in the field by Café editor using a lap top with pre-designed CSPRO program. The Café system proved to be effective in keeping checks for errors and allowing correction of errors to be done by interviewer in the field thereby maintaining high quality of data. The completed data entry was sent to Yogya at least once a week. This enabled the central office to monitor the progress and the performance of the teams.

A monitoring system was set up at the central office in Yogyakarta to check the completeness and the quality of data sent to the central office. This is the responsibility of a Data Manager at the central office. Web-site was set up for uploading data from the field.

Upon completion interview of three enumeration area, field editor uploaded data file using internet available locally. In the case of remote areas where internet facility is not available he/she waited till the team come out of the remote area and find suitable internet access to use. Each team was provided with a flash disk to save the data file

before uploading. Data manager checked the completeness of data and ensure that the data file is not corrupted. The completed questionnaires were checked against the data files to ensure that no questionnaires have been left out.

6. Data Cleaning

The activity of data cleaning since the first week after the field work commenced. Any type of error found was communicated to the teams in the field via field coordinators and supervisors. At the office the physical questionnaires were also be checked against the electronic data file.

The consumption and income value are the most essential sections of the project. We made an effort to have zero data entry error in these sections by double punched these particular section. This activity was conducted in Survey Meter office in Yogya. The results of double entry are the following: the average error rate of the CAFÉ in the field is 0.7 % the second data entry is only 0.12 % (the number of variables double entry per household is 38 variables). The detail error per enumeration area is presented in appendix B.

In addition to double entry, more than 60 consistencies checks were created to clean the data and intensif check between consumption data 2007 and 2010 (Appendix B). The list of inconsistency cases were printed and checked by looking up the questionnaire. In the process of cleaning data, we changed the data if supporting facts in the questionnaire were available. We also use confirmation to respondents by phone, interviewer note, confirmation of interviewers, supervisor or ATL or hard copy of documents as supporting information to make changes .After the cleaning process, there are numbers of cases that are still not consistent but there are valid reasons. For these cases we checked related information in the questionnaire to explain the inconsistency and did not make any changes. The completed list and reason for unchanged data is presented in Appendix B.

The other part of cleaning data is other coding and open ended coding. This exercise involved giving specific code to “others” variable and responses on open ended questions. The result of other coding and open ended coding is presented in Appendix B. The questionnaire and data were also updated based on this re-recoding (see Appendix A for the revised questionnaire and CD for the data).

The cleaning data conducted since the first week of field work with 11 persons until 30 April 2010 at SurveyMeter Office. The list of field worker and data cleaning person presented in Appendix D.

H. COMMENT AND DISCUSSION

1. Comment on Questions or Modules

The following section discussed issues related to the questions or modules used in the SEDAP 2010 questionnaire that we learned from our experience during the period of data collection.

Book RT :

1. Block 1. Preprinted Location of Respondents: The information draw from additional questions in SEDAP 2007 on address of respondents such as the complete address of household including location notes, telephone number/cell Phone and route to the house of household. Those questions were very helpful on finding households in 2010.
2. Block 2. Characteristics of Households. It works well. There have been changes in the headship of the households. About 15% of 2002 households have different household head either in 2007 or 2010 or in both years.
3. Block 4. Preprinted Households Roster. In SUSENAS 2002, the household roster collects basic characteristics of household members such as name of household members, relation to household head, sex, age and marital status. In SEDAP 2007 we collected additional information on birth date of respondents. In SEDAP 20010 we preprint 2007 data such as name, age, birth date and gender. The interviewers do not have problem on asking questions in this block except on age. Older people have difficulty to report their age and it requires interviewer's probing using important event such as Indonesia Independent Day etc to estimate the age of respondent.
4. Block 6. Housing. There has been no problem with questions in this block. In data check and cleaning process we found there is data entry error in entering type of floor. We have corrected these errors.
5. Block 7a. Food Consumptions and block 7b. Non Food Consumptions are SUSENAS 2002 questions. Few respondents have difficulty on giving estimation on cost of house rent when the household owned the house. Some respondents gave very high estimation value and the other very low. These cause the total per capita consumption of some households fall in the category above 98 percentile. Appendix B presents some description of households who have very high consumption (above 98 percentile), very low consumption (below 1 percentile) and very high and low (above 98 percentile/ below 1 percentile) in change of consumption between 2007 and 2010.

Social Capital and Governance Book (new module in 2007 round). The nature of the questions is very different to the SUSENAS 2002 type questions. All MSP questions are questions on opinions or perception. We seek answers from household head but when the household head were not available we asked the questions to his spouse. In general the household head gave better information than his spouse, mostly due to the fact that household head is more actively involved in community social activities. However due to the limited time of the team in a desa and higher activity of household head the interview of book MSP could not be all done directly with the household head. In 2007 SEDAP household heads answered 74% of book MSP, 18% and 8% answered by spouses and other adult household members respectively. Meanwhile in 2010 the composition is almost same as in 2007.

MSP book has many “others” category. We did coding of other responses and the result is presented in the appendix. The outcome of this others coding may need to be included as a separate category of the respected variable in the next round of the survey. Below we present notes for MSP book:

1. Section TB. Social Activities and Cooperation, MSP01-MSP04. The problem in 2010 same as in 2007. Generally respondents have difficulty or confuse answering MSP04 which is question on the steps taken by the community when problems arise in the community. The questions asks for three main step and usually respondents only think about the final step and do not know other steps especially when they were not involved in those steps. In 2010, this problem also mention by interviewers in CP note.
2. Section PM. Empowerment, Political action and Governance, MSP10-MSP19. In 2007 about 13% of respondents mentioned that they do not know the number of meeting in the last one year (PM10). These don't know response mostly answer given by spouse or other female household members or older people who were not participate or involve in the community social activity. The quality of the answer in 2010 is better than in 2007. Less respondents answer don't know for PM10X and PM10. However in CP some interviewers still recoding that MSP10 is one of difficult question for respondents.
3. Section PIK. Poverty Perception and Indicator, MSP20 – MSP24 : Questions on characteristics of poor household, what made the household poor and ways to overcome poverty were the most difficult questions. In 2007 about 4% of households were not willing to answers questions on whether her/his household, poor or not (MSP21) but in 2010 only 2%. This indicates the data in 2010 better than 2007.
4. Section PPK. Section on KDP program, MSP25-MSP27. Respondents had no difficulty answering these questions. In 2007 only 25% of respondents ever heard about the KDP program and out of this only 58% received benefit from KDP program. The condition in 2010 improved, 45% respondent reported that they heard about PPK spontaneously and the other 16% mentions yes after explained

by interviewers. In 2010, 69% of the household reported themselves received benefit.

Book INDIVIDU. To reduce the burden of household head and for accuracy of the data, we allow adult household member to answer individual book directly. As the result in 2007, 41% of book INDIVIDU was answered by household members them self . The other answers were by his/her parents 36% and by his/her spouse about 10%. The condition in 2010 little bit difference, book INDIVIDU answers by household member themselves 46 %, by their parents and 33% and by their spouse 8%. Notes on book INDIVIDU are as follows:

1. Block 5a. Health Information: In 2007, symptom question on B5R1 got a lot of “other” responses which have been recoding. In 2010 some of them have been added as category. On B5R3 that asks number of days respondent could not do normal activities because of the symptom, although the time reference of this question is during last month, in 2007 about 1% of respondents reported more than 30 days for symptom such as paralyse or epilepsy which have occurred far before the date of the survey. But in 2010 this response has been set the maximum value is 30.
2. Block 5d. Labor Information. SUSENAS 2002 did not ask income for self employee and in SEDAP 2007 we added this question in B5R52. Questions on KDP program was also added : whether respondent ever work on KDP program and if yes how much respondent earned per month form this activity. All those questions were repeated again in 2010. If in 2007 about 1-2% of respondents have difficulty reporting income, in 2010 less than 1% has difficulty answer income questions.

2. Comment on Survey Operation

The following section discuss lessons we learned throughout the whole survey operation from recruitment of field team members to data cleaning process wherever possible suggest improvement for the future waves of the PNPM-KDP evaluation surveys .

1. In general the quality and commitment to work hard the field worker from outside Java less than field worker from Java. Therefore in 2010 in remote area such as Sulawesi Tenggara and Sulawesi Utara we sent good interviewers from Java.
2. The permission at national, provincial and kabupaten, kecamatan and desa level was obtained before the team go to the field. This procedure was worked well, save a time of the supervisor and can be use to do data entry CAFÉ.

Re-Release Data 2007

The final data set of SEDAP 2007 is in STATA format. The data consists of 32 sub-files that contain information collected across the three books. Sub-file names reflect the book and sub-block or section of questionnaire book the data represent. Sub-files from a given book begin with the same prefix. In most cases variable names reflect the question number represented by the variable, providing an easy link between the questionnaire and the codebook variables. Table 13, Table 14 and Table 15 outline a summary of sub-file containing of book RT, MSP and INDIVIDU. The codebook content of SEDAP 2007 data-base is presented in the appendix. Meanwhile Table 16 lists special code used for non response in SEDAP 2007 data.

The Merging 2007 and 2010 Data

The final data set Merging SEDAP 2007 and 2010 is in STATA format. The data consists of 32 sub-files that contain information collected across the three books. Sub-file names reflect the book and sub-block or section of questionnaire book the data represent. Sub-files from a given book begin with the same prefix. Table 23 lists the three books and the sub-file prefix for the Merging SEDAP 2007 and 2010 data. In most cases variable names reflect the question number represented by the variable, providing an easy link between the questionnaire and the codebook variables. Table 24, Table 25, Table 26 and Table 27 outline a summary of sub-file containing of book RT, MSP and INDIVIDU. The codebook content of the Merging SEDAP 2007 and 2010 data-base is presented in the appendix. Meanwhile Table 28 lists special code used for non response in SEDAP 2010 data.

J. USER'S GUIDE

This section describes how sub-files SEDAP 2007/2010 can be linked to each other, how the database SEDAP 2007/2010 linked with SUSENAS 2002 data and crosswalk variable between surveys.

1. Link ID

The household level sub-files SEDAP 2007/2010 can be merged using Household Identifier Number, IDRT_07/IDRT_10. IDRT_07/IDRT_10 is already built-in on each sub-files SEDAP 2007/2010 data. IDRT_07/IDRT_10 is a household identifier consist of 9 digits numerical variable which can be divided into 4 parts:

Meanwhile individual level data can be merged using Household Identifier Number (IDRT_07/IDRT_10) and Person Identifier Number, IDI_07/IDI_10. Each individual level sub-file data has built-in with IDRT_07/IDRT_10 and IDI_07/IDI_10. IDI_07/IDI_10 is a numeric variable which represent the individual's person number from household roster. The person number run from 1 to the number of persons in the household roster. The variables IDRT_07/IDRT_10 and IDI_07/IDI_10 uniquely define a household member across all households.

2. Merging SEDAP 2007/2010 with SUSENAS 2002 data

Please remember that SEDAP 2007/2010 and SUSENAS 2002 are only panel at household level. SEDAP 2007 and SUSENAS 2002 is not panel at individual level since we didn't have name of 2002 household member as the baseline to do individual panel study. All sub-files SEDAP has built-in variable SUSENAS 2002 ID which consist of seven variables: b1r1, b1r2, b1r3, b1r4, b1r5, b1r7 and b1r8. Those seven variables are:

3. Merging SEDAP 2007 dan SEDAP 2010

The household level sub-files SEDAP 2007 and 2010 can be merged using Household Identifier Number, IDRT_07 and IDRT_10 (before merging rename both household ID to IDRT) . IDRT_07/IDRT_10 is already built- in on each sub-files SEDAP 2007/2010 data. Meanwhile individual level data can be merged using Household Identifier Number (IDRT_07 and IDRT_10) and Person Identifier Number, IDI_07 and IDI_10 (before merging rename both person ID to IDI). Each individual level sub-file data has built-in with IDRT_07/IDRT_10 and IDI_07/IDI_10. IDI_07/IDI_10 is a numeric variable which represent the individual's person number from household roster. The person number run from 1 to the number of persons in the household roster. The variables IDRT_07/IDRT_10 and IDI_07/IDI_10 uniquely define a household member across all households.
