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Community definition: Administrative areas (such as zone/Kushet/Got/Ganda for urban and village for rural areas) will normally be used as a starting point (operational definition, referred to in this survey as “Localities”). From there we will proceed with the questionnaire allowing for an expansion of the original boundaries, these boundaries may vary depending on the topic of interest. For instance, the relevant community space for the sections included in the Child-Specific Module is one that encompasses the relevant provider –as much as the user– of the specific service investigated in each section (Education, Health, etc). In Ethiopia, we will keep the same operational definition as round 2.

Selection of informants: Each section has a protocol to be followed to identify one or several informants, as appropriate.


