

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I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Burundi perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *General Issues Facing Burundi*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results*
- *The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *Working with the World Bank Group*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Burundi*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From May to June 2017, 374 stakeholders of the WBG in Burundi were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; bilateral/multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; private foundations; the financial sector/private banks; NGOs/community based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the judiciary branch; and other organizations.

A total of 218 stakeholders participated in the survey (58% response rate). Respondents either received the questionnaires via courier and returned it accordingly, or completed the questionnaire with an independent fielding consultant.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.


The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'15 (response rate was 67%, N=209). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'15 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in appendices A, B, C, D, and F. For the weighted stakeholder breakdown and year comparison results, please refer to Appendix E (page 102).



III. Demographics of the Sample

Current Position

- For further analyses, respondents from the Office of the President/Prime Minister and the office of a minister were combined. Respondents from NGOs/community based organizations, trade unions, and faith-based groups were combined in the “CSO” category; and the small number of respondents from the office of parliamentarian, independent government institutions, and respondents from other organizations were included in the “Other” category. There were no respondents from private foundations, financial sector/private banks, youth groups, and the judiciary branch.




“Which of the following best describes your current position?” (Respondents chose from a list.)

Area of Primary Specialization







Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group




"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily engage with in Burundi?" (Respondents chose from a list.)



III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly lower levels of familiarity with the WBG than respondents in the FY'15 Country Survey (weighted mean in FY'17 = 5.7; weighted mean in FY'15 = 6.3)¹.
- **Stakeholder groups:** Respondents from the PMU and consultants working on WBG projects were significantly more familiar with the WBG than other stakeholder groups.
- Respondents' levels of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their ratings of the WBG's overall effectiveness in Burundi, and significantly, moderately correlated with the extent to which the WBG plays a relevant role in development in Burundi, and the extent to which the WBG contributes to the country's development results.

(1 - "Not familiar at all", 10 - "Extremely familiar")



IV. General Issues Facing Burundi

Headed in the Right Direction²

- **Year comparison:** This year's respondents and the respondents in the FY'15 had statistically similar views about the direction in which Burundi is headed.
- **Stakeholder groups:** In this year's Country Survey, respondents from the Office of the President/Prime Minister/Minister and local governments were significantly more likely to indicate that Burundi is headed in the right direction, while respondents from CSOs and bilateral/multilateral agencies were significantly less positive about the prospect of Burundi.





Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'15 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priorities in Burundi were “*governance*” (31%), “*food security*” (31%), and “*energy*” (30%).




"Listed below are a number of development priorities in Burundi. Please identify which of the following you consider the most important development priorities in Burundi. (Choose no more than THREE)"

What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty

- **Year comparison:** In the previous FY'15 Country Survey, respondents indicated that the greatest contributors to poverty reduction in Burundi were “*economic growth*” (38%), “*rural development*” (26%), “*agricultural development*” (26%) and “*private sector development*” (25%).














"When World Bank Group assisted reform efforts fail or are slow to take place, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"




The World Bank Group’s Overall Effectiveness³ (Indicator Question)




"To what extent do you believe the World Bank Group is adequately staffed in Burundi?"


The World Bank Group Partnering with the Right People on the Ground

“When working with the World Bank Group on programs, projects and other activities, do you believe that the team ...?”





Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Stakeholder groups:** Respondents from PMUs/consultants/contractors on WBG-supported projects had the highest mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions, whereas respondents from private sector and academia had significantly lower mean ratings. Responses for individual indicator questions by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix B (see page 67).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.1) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.5). Responses for individual indicator questions by exposure to the WBG can be found in Appendix F (page 109).




Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10


"When thinking about the World Bank Group's role, which activity do you believe is of greatest VALUE and which activity is of second greatest value in Burundi?"






“To what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group’s work and support help the poorest in Burundi?” (Respondents chose from a list.)












"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"









Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work and Activities¹²




"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities in the work you do?"



Meeting Burundi’ Knowledge Needs¹³ (Indicator Question)





Technical Quality of the WBG’s Knowledge Work and Activities (Indicator Question)













"In addition to the regular relations with the national government, which TWO of the following groups should the World Bank Group collaborate with more in your country?"








A. Which THREE areas below would benefit most from the World Bank Group playing a leading role among international partners in Burundi?




"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Burundi? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)




"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?
(Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)



Face to Face Interaction with the WBG










"Are you aware of the World Bank Group's Access to Information Policy under which the WBG will now disclose any information in its possession that is not on a list of exceptions?"

"Do you have access to the Internet?"




"Which Internet connection do you use primarily when visiting a World Bank Group website?"



