I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Guatemala perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- General Issues Facing Guatemala
- Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group
- World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results
- The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities
- Working with the World Bank Group
- The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Guatemala
- Communication and Information Sharing
- Background Information

II. Methodology

From April to July 2019, 354 stakeholders of the WBG in Guatemala were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President; office of a minister; Congress; ministries/secretarial departments; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; the financial sector/private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community-based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the judiciary branch; and other organizations.

A total of 160 stakeholders participated in the survey (45% response rate). Respondents received the questionnaires via online survey platform Qualtrics.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'16 (response rate was 76%, N=279). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'16 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in appendices A, B, C and E. 




"Which of the following best describes your current affiliation?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Area of Primary Specialization




Geographic Locations

Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group




"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily collaborate/work with in Guatemala?"




"How familiar are you with the work of the World Bank Group in Guatemala?" (1-"Not familiar at all", 10-"Extremely familiar")


"How familiar are you with the work of these organizations in Guatemala?"








"When you think about the future in Guatemala, are you ...?"

Perceptions of Economic Opportunity


Percentage of Respondents (N=160)










"To what extent do you trust each of the following groups to do what is right?"






"When thinking about development efforts in Guatemala, do you think that civil society (e.g., NGOs, CBOs) should ... ?"

Attributions for Slow/Failed Reform Efforts




"When economic and/or social reform efforts fail or are slow to take place in Guatemala, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"


Overall Effectiveness of the World Bank Group vs. Other Development Banks³ (Indicator Question)




Influence on Guatemala's Development Agenda (Indicator Question)



■ Collaboration: Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.0) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.2). 


Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10


"When thinking about the World Bank Group's role, which activity do you believe is of greatest VALUE and which activity is of second greatest value in Guatemala?"


"Which of the following do you identify as the World Bank Group's greatest WEAKNESSES in its work in Guatemala? (Choose no more than TWO)"



"How EFFECTIVE do you believe the World Bank Group is in terms of the work it does in the following areas of development in Guatemala?"





"From your perspective, which of the following best describes the World Bank Group's current emphasis on investing in human capital (e.g., education, health, social protection)?"




The World Bank Group's Work in Guatemala: Year Comparison⁸



Overall Perceptions: Year Comparison⁹




"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"







Percentage of Respondents (N=137)




"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities in the work you do?" (Respondents chose from a list.)


Meeting Guatemala's Knowledge Needs¹¹ (Indicator Question)








"Which of the following SHOULD the World Bank Group do to make itself of greater value in Guatemala? (Choose no more than TWO)"








Refugees: Donor Community's Support



"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Guatemala? (Choose no more than TWO)"








"How frequently do you interact with the World Bank Group now in Guatemala?" (Respondents chose from a list.)
