

I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Panama perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- General Issues Facing Panama
- Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group
- World Bank Group's Effectiveness and Results
- The World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities
- Working with the World Bank Group
- The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Panama
- Communication and Information Sharing
- Background Information

II. Methodology

From April to June 2019, 1,120 stakeholders of the WBG in Panama were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a Minister; office of a Parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; the financial sector/private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community-based organizations; the media; independent government institutions; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the judiciary branch; and other organizations.

A total of 138 stakeholders participated in the survey (12% response rate). Respondents completed the questionnaire with a representative from the local fielding agency, received the questionnaire via courier or via mail and returned it accordingly, or they completed it online via survey platform Qualtrics.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'16 (response rate was 48%, N=160). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. As a result, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'16 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in appendices A, B, C and E. 




"Which of the following best describes your current position?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Area of Primary Specialization




"Please identify the primary specialization of your work." (Respondents chose from a list.)



Geographic Locations






"Which best represents your geographic location?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Percentage of Respondents (N=42)




"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily collaborate/work with in Panama?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WBG compared to respondents in the FY'16 Country Survey (weighted mean in FY'19 = 7.4; weighted mean in FY'16 = 7.3)².
- Impact of familiarity: Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness in Panama. Also, respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, moderately corelated with their agreement that the WBG currently plays a relevant role in Panama's development and with their ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in the country.




"How familiar are you with the work of the World Bank Group in Panama?"








"When you think about the future in Panama, are you ... ?"

Perceptions of Economic Opportunity


Percentage of Respondents (N=137)

Perceptions of Improvement and Decline in Specific Areas




"Please describe the direction Panama is moving in, when considering ...?"



What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty








"To what extent do you trust each of the following groups to do what is right? "




Trust in the Private Sector

Percentage of Respondents (N=133)



Attributions for Slow/Failed Reform Efforts




"When economic and/or social reform efforts fail or are slow to take place in Panama, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"



Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

■ Collaboration: Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.7) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 6.9). 


Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10




"Which of the following do you identify as the World Bank Group's greatest WEAKNESSES in its work in Panama? (Choose no more than TWO)"










"To what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's work and support help the poorest in Panama?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

"From your perspective, which of the following best describes the World Bank Group's current emphasis on investing in human capital (e.g., education, health, social protection)?"




The World Bank Group's Work in Panama: Year Comparison⁹



"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"





"To what extent is the World Bank Group an effective development partner in Panama, in terms of each of the following?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")





Frequency of Consulting WBG Knowledge Work and Activities






"How frequently do you consult World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities in the work you do?" (Respondents chose from a list.)








"Which of the following SHOULD the World Bank Group do to make itself of greater value in Panama? (Choose no more than TWO)"











Percentage of Respondents (N=126)




"How frequently do you interact with the World Bank Group now in Panama?" (Respondents chose from a list.)
