## I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Equatorial Guinea perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *Overall Context*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Work and Engagement on the Ground*
- *World Bank Group's Support in Development Areas*
- *World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Equatorial Guinea*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

## II. Methodology

From February to July 2020, 450 stakeholders of the WBG in Equatorial Guinea were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; independent government institutions; the judicial system; state-owned enterprises; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; the financial sector/private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community based organizations; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the media; and other organizations.

A total of 165 stakeholders participated in the survey (37% response rate). Respondents received the questionnaire via mail or courier and returned it accordingly, or they filled out the questionnaire via the online survey platform.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

As a rule, the results in this year's Country Survey are compared to the results of the previous cycle of the Country Survey. In Equatorial Guinea, the FY'17 and FY'20 samples differed significantly, and respondents' familiarity with the World Bank Group was relatively low (less than 4 out of 10 on a 10-point scale) in both FY'17 and FY'20. Therefore, the year comparisons and comparisons between those who collaborate with the WBG and those who do not collaborate with the WBG were not conducted as statistically unviable.








#### Geographic Locations

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#### Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group




"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily collaborate/work with in Equatorial Guinea?"

### III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

#### Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Impact of familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WBG were significantly, strongly correlated with their agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in Equatorial Guinea's development and significantly, moderately correlated with their ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness in Equatorial Guinea and with their ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps to achieve development results in Equatorial Guinea.




"How familiar are you with the work of the World Bank Group in Equatorial Guinea?" (1-"Not familiar at all", 10-"Extremely familiar")


### Headed in the Right Direction

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### Perceptions of Economic Opportunity




"Do you think that economic opportunity for citizens in Equatorial Guinea is ... ?"




"Please describe the direction Equatorial Guinea is moving in, when considering ... ?"












**"To what extent do you trust private sector to engage in public service delivery in Equatorial Guinea?"**






"To what extent does the World Bank Group's work help to achieve development results in Equatorial Guinea?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")


### Influence on Equatorial Guinea's Development Agenda (*Indicator Question*)






Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10




**“When thinking about the World Bank Group’s role in Equatorial Guinea, which activity do you VALUE the most? (Choose no more than TWO)”**




**"Which of the following do you identify as the World Bank Group's greatest WEAKNESSES in its work in Equatorial Guinea? (Choose no more than TWO)"**

### Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas




**"How EFFECTIVE do you believe the World Bank Group is in terms of the work it does in the following areas of development in Equatorial Guinea?"**



### The WBG's Human Capital Investment









### Qualities of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities






**"Which of the following SHOULD the World Bank Group do to make itself of greater value in Equatorial Guinea? (Choose no more than TWO)"**








**"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Equatorial Guinea? (Choose no more than TWO)"**




**"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?



### WBG Interaction Frequency




"How frequently do you interact with the World Bank Group now in Equatorial Guinea?" (Respondents chose from a list.)
