I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Mauritania perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *Overall Context*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Work and Engagement on the Ground*
- *World Bank Group's Support in Development Areas*
- *World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Mauritania*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From March to May 2021, 494 stakeholders of the WBG in Mauritania were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President/Prime Minister; offices of Ministers; offices of Parliamentarians; employees of ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; independent government institutions; the judiciary; state-owned enterprises; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; the financial sector and private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community-based organizations; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; and the media.

A total of 348 stakeholders participated in the survey (70% response rate). Respondents received the questionnaire via a courier or via email and returned it accordingly, some completed the questionnaire with a representative of the fielding agency, and some completed the questionnaire via the online platform (Qualtrics).

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

Note that the body of the report presents data on selected questions of the survey. Please refer to Appendix A for data on all survey questions. Appendices B and C present data on selected questions. Additional data breakdowns are available upon request.



II. Methodology (continued)

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'18 (response rate was 63%, N=321). Comparing responses across Country Surveys reflect changes in attitudes over time, but also changes in respondent samples and changes to the survey instrument itself. To reduce the influence of the latter factor, only those questions with similar response scales/options were analyzed. To reduce the influence of the former, the samples from FY '18 and FY '21 were weighted to have equivalent stakeholder groupings, allowing for more statistically reliable comparisons. Due to this weighting, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'18 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in this report.

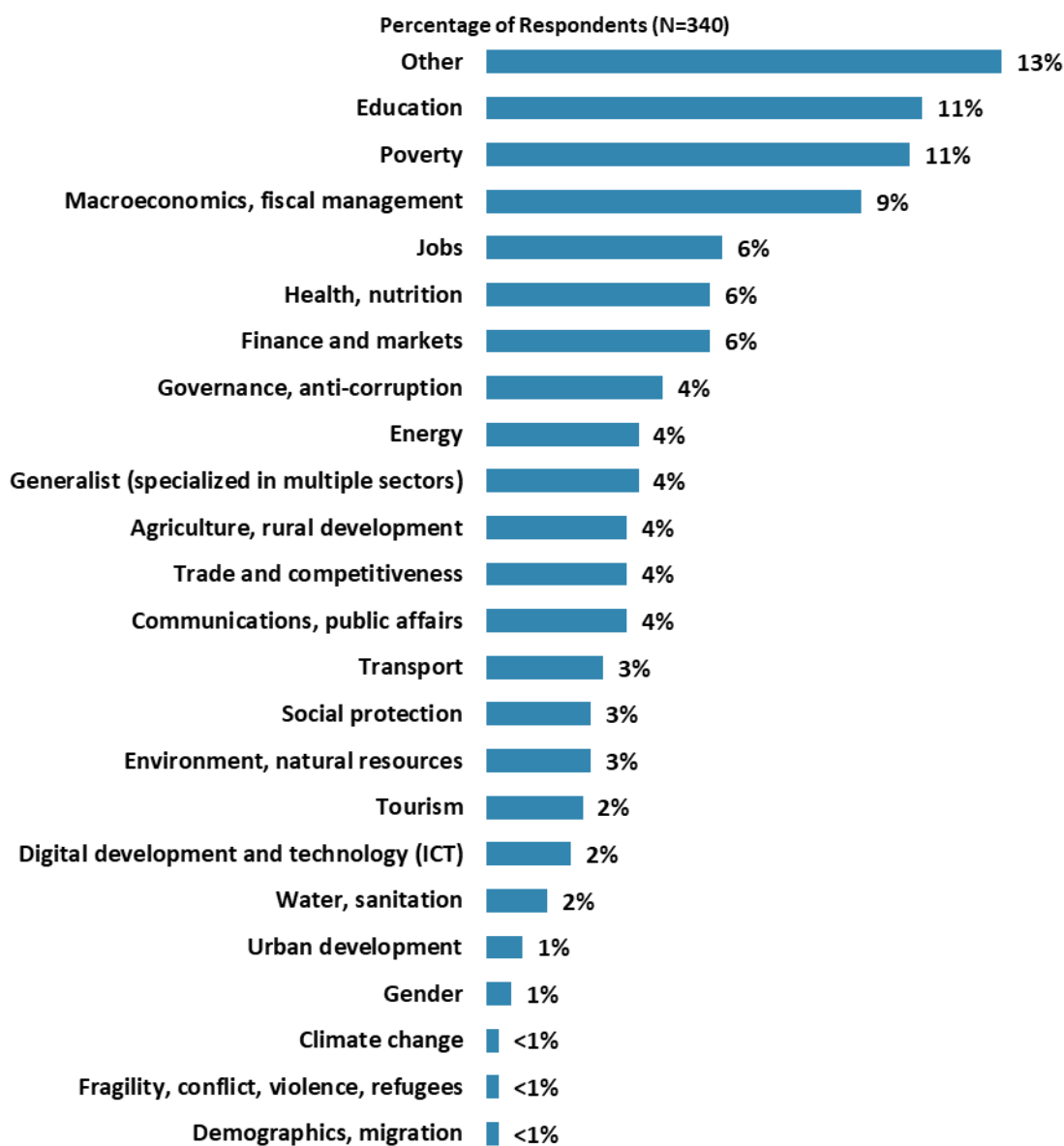
“Which of the following best describes your current affiliation? (Select only ONE response)”

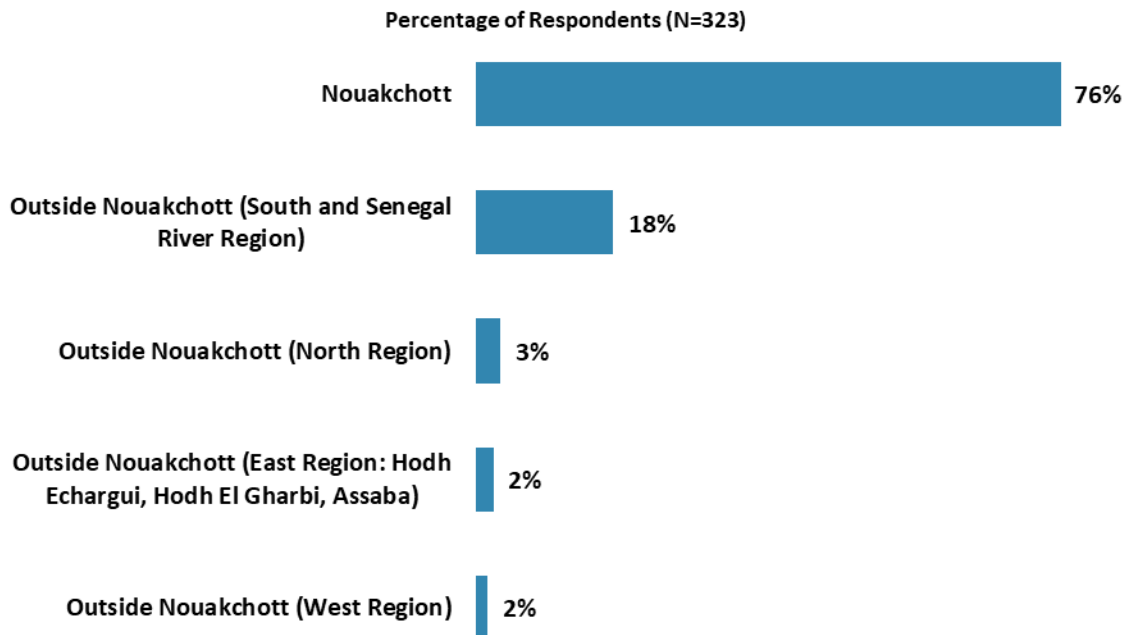


"Please identify the primary specialization of your work. (Select only ONE response)"

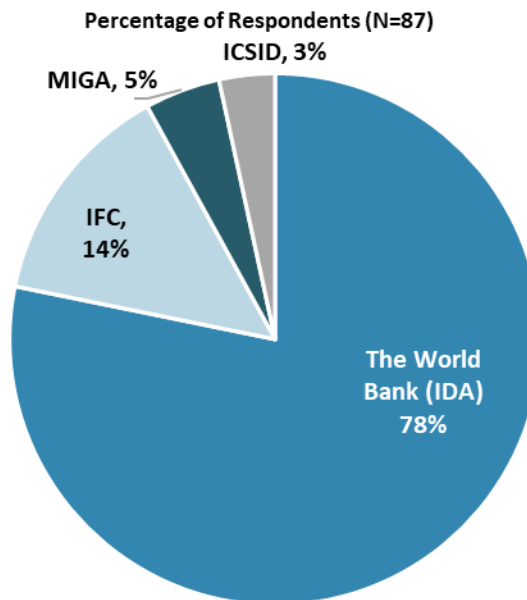

Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group



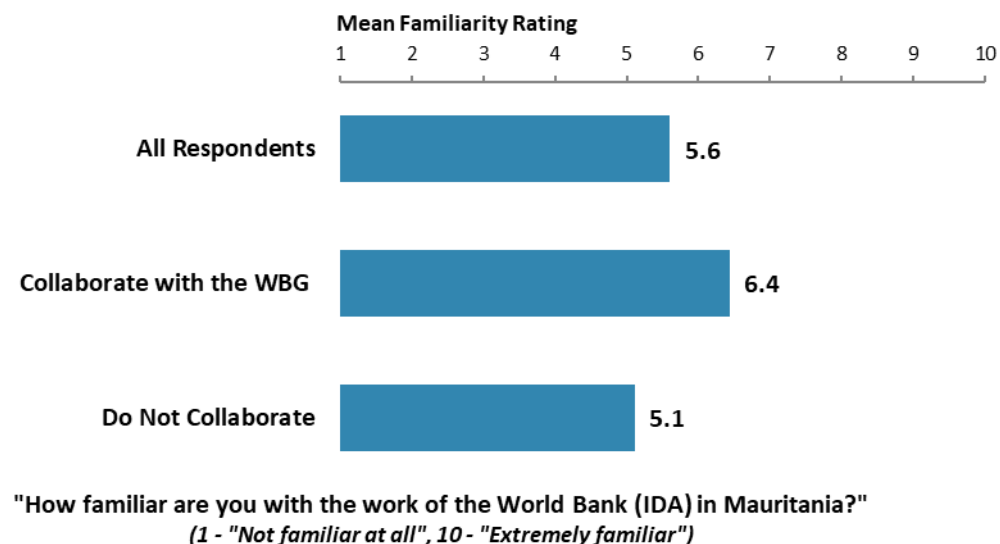
"If yes [professionally collaborate with the WBG], which of the following agencies of the WBG do you primarily collaborate/work with in Mauritania? (Select only ONE response)"

III. Demographics of the Sample (continued)

Familiarity with the World Bank²

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WB compared to respondents in the FY '18 Country Survey (weighted mean in FY '21 = 5.6; weighted mean in FY '18 = 5.3).
- **Collaboration:** Respondents who reported that they collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher levels of familiarity with the WB compared to respondents who do not collaborate.
- **Stakeholder Groups:** Respondents across stakeholder groups reported statistically similar levels of familiarity with the WB.
- **Impact of familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity with the WB were significantly, moderately correlated with their ratings for the WB's overall effectiveness in Mauritania, their agreement that the WBG plays a relevant role in Mauritania's development, and with their ratings of the extent to which the WBG's work helps achieve development results in Mauritania.

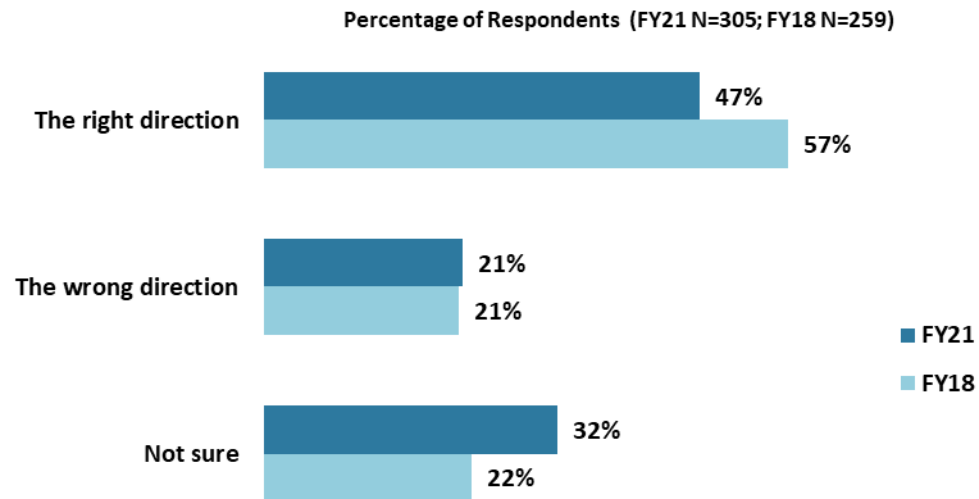

Headed in the Right Direction



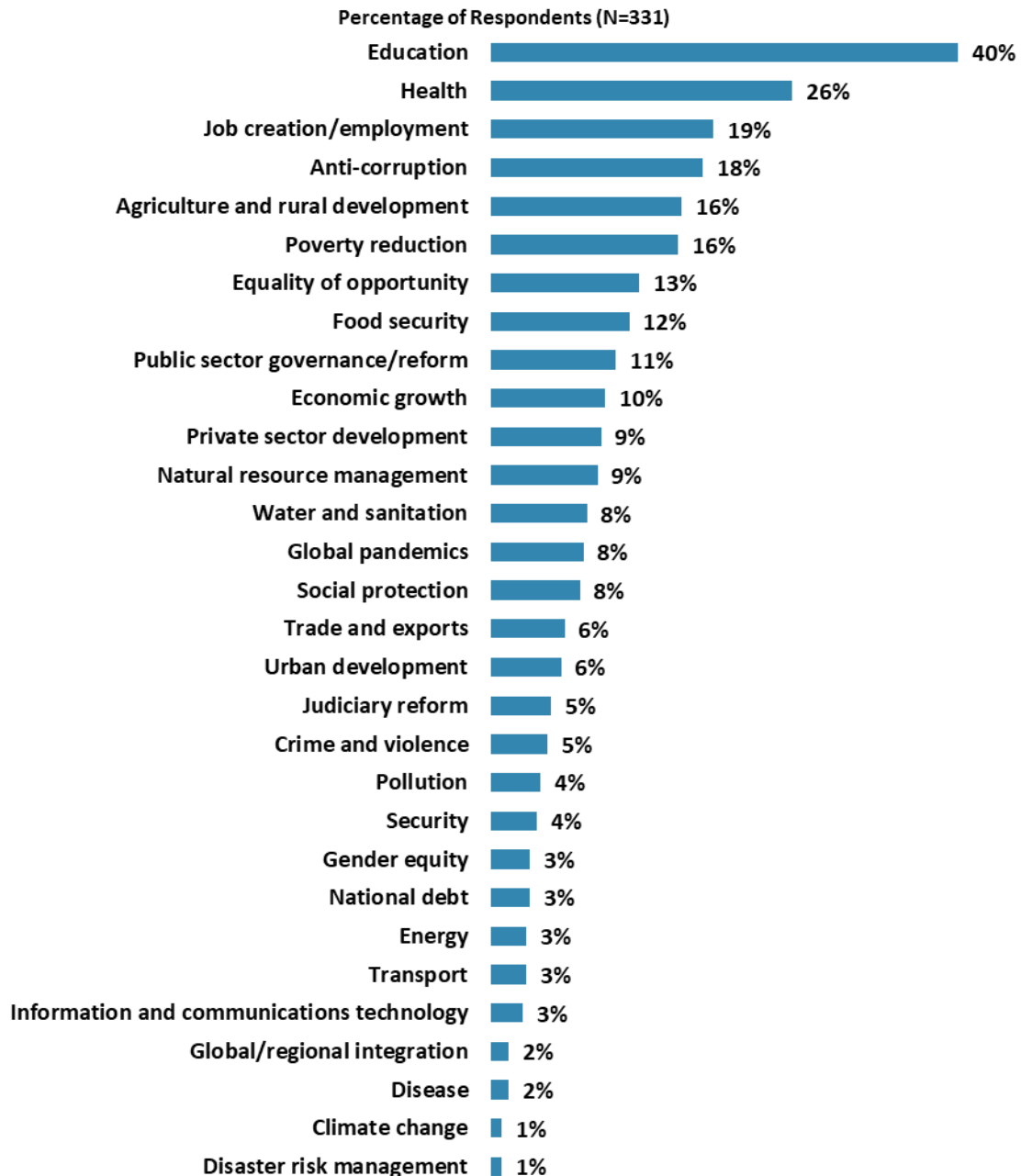
"In general, would you say that Mauritania is headed in ... ?" (Respondents chose from a list.)

Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '18 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priority in Mauritania was “*education*” (64%), followed by “*health*” (32%), “*public sector governance/reform*” (28%), “*agriculture and rural development*” (19%), and “*job creation/employment*” (19%). Of note, “*anti-corruption*” gained in priority in FY '21, with 18% of respondents selecting it compared to just 11% in FY '18.



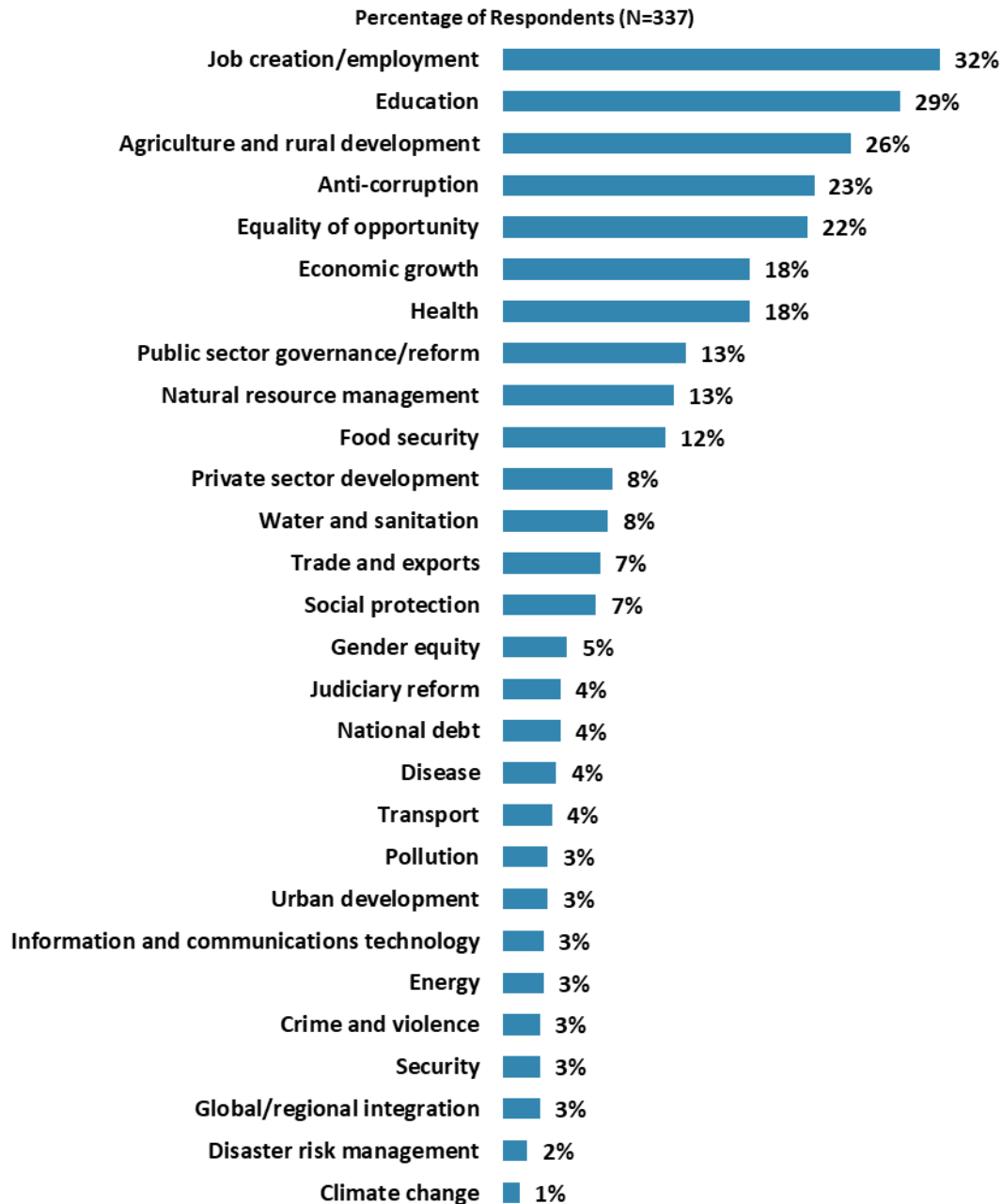

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '18 Country Survey indicated that the biggest contributors to poverty reduction in Mauritania were “*agriculture and rural development*” (43%), “*education*” (42%), and “*job creation/employment*” (36%).

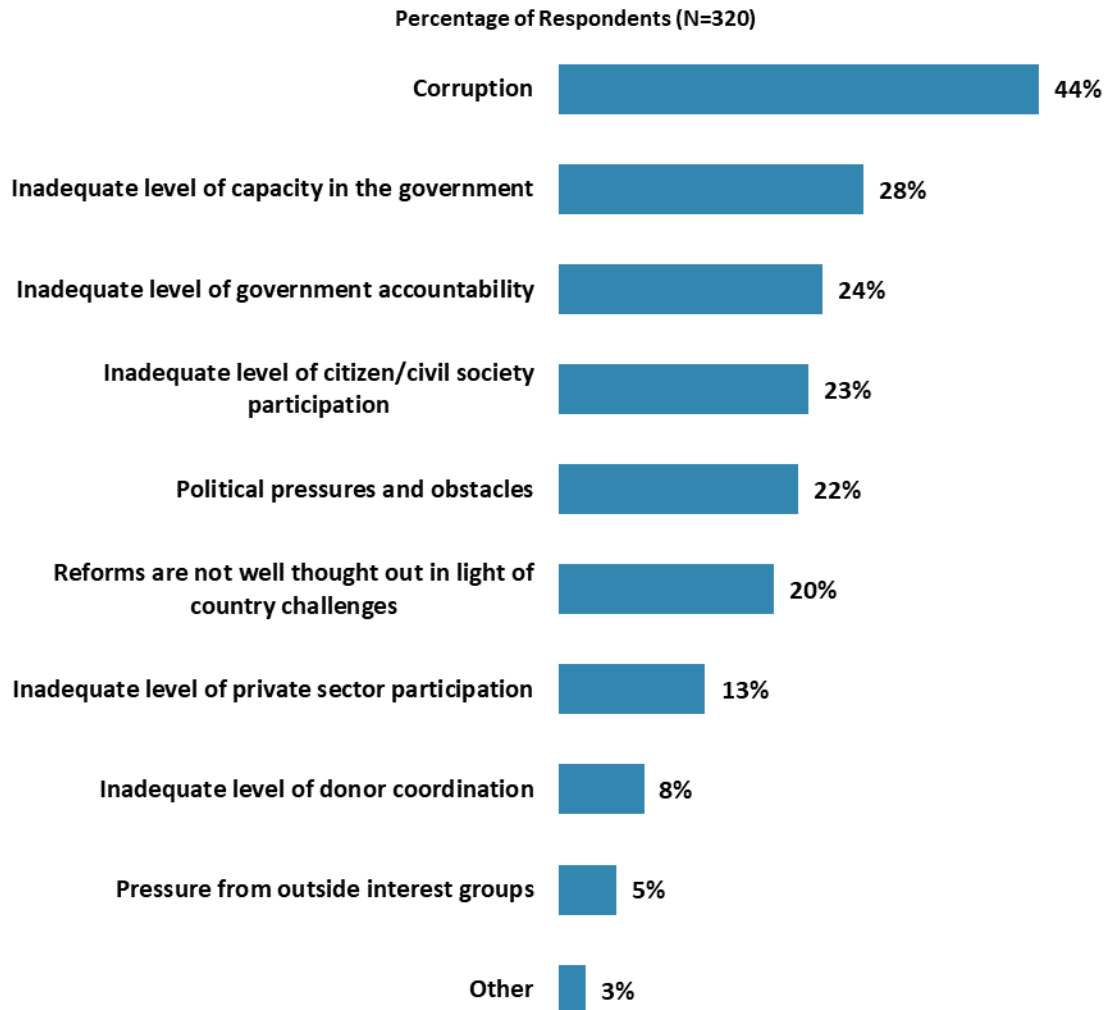


"To what extent do you trust each of the following groups to do what is right?"

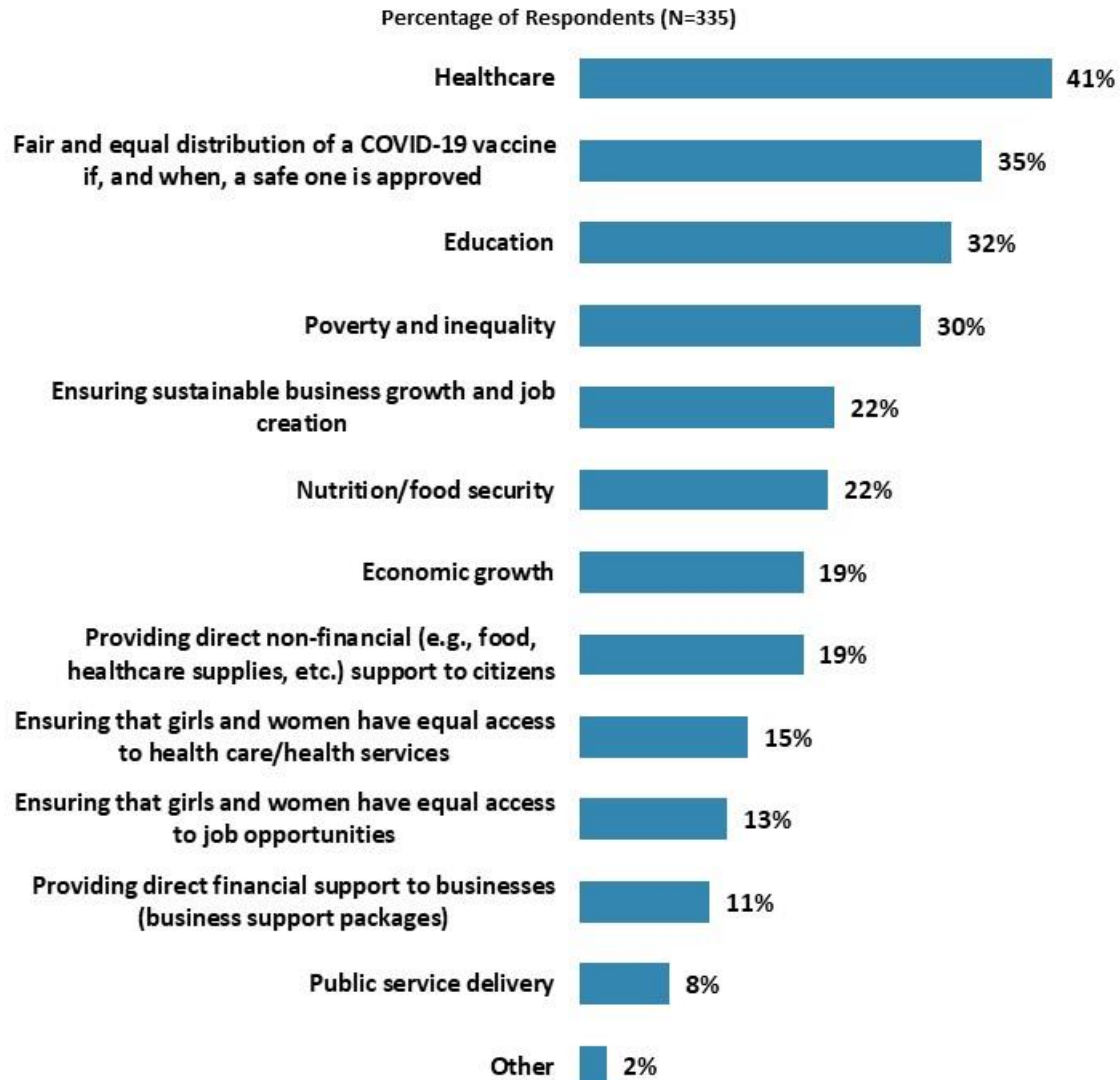


"When economic and/or social reform efforts fail or are slow to take place in Mauritania, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"

Preferred Areas for Government Focus during COVID-19 Pandemic

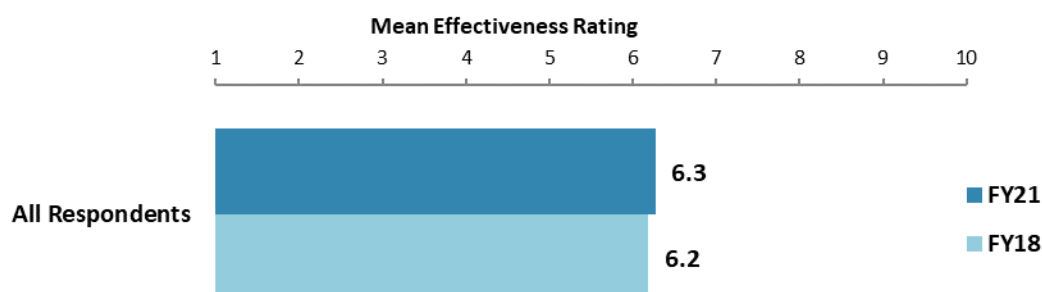

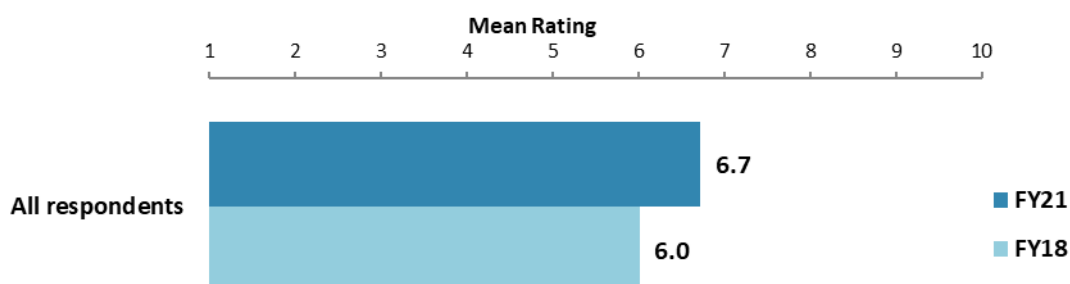

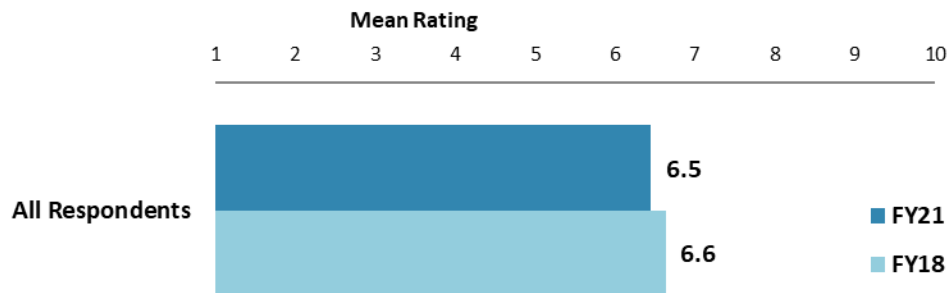

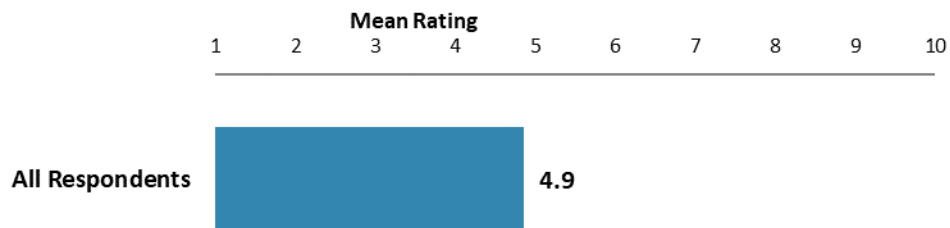

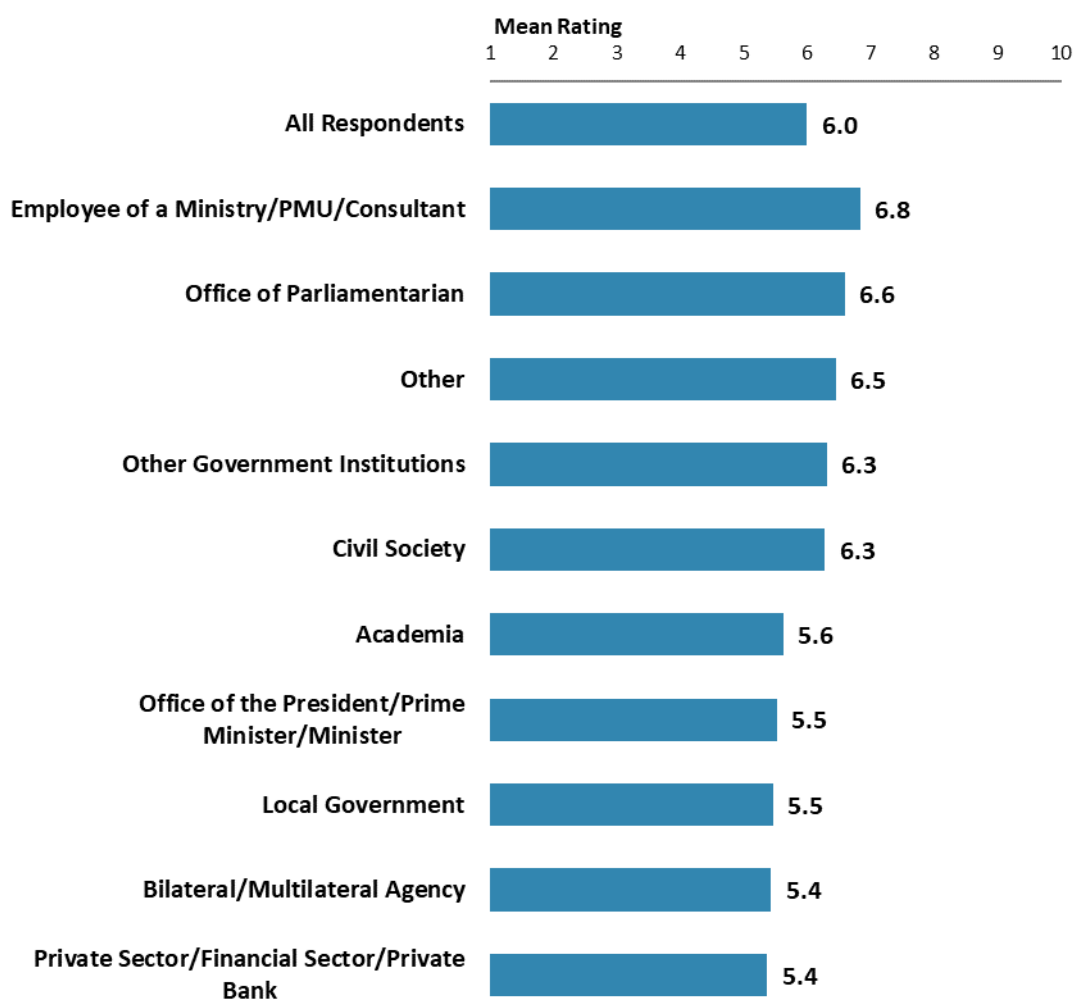
"To what extent do you believe the World Bank Group is adequately staffed in Mauritania?"

Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Collaboration:** Respondents who reported that they collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions (mean rating = 6.6) compared to respondents who reported that they do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 5.8).
- **Stakeholder groups:** Although it did not reach statistical significance, there was a strong trend that employees of ministries and respondents from PMUs/Consultants on WBG-supported projects had the highest mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-eight COS indicator questions whereas respondents from academia, the office of the President/Prime Minister/Minister, local government, bilateral/multilateral agencies, and the private sector/financial sector/private banks had much lower mean ratings. 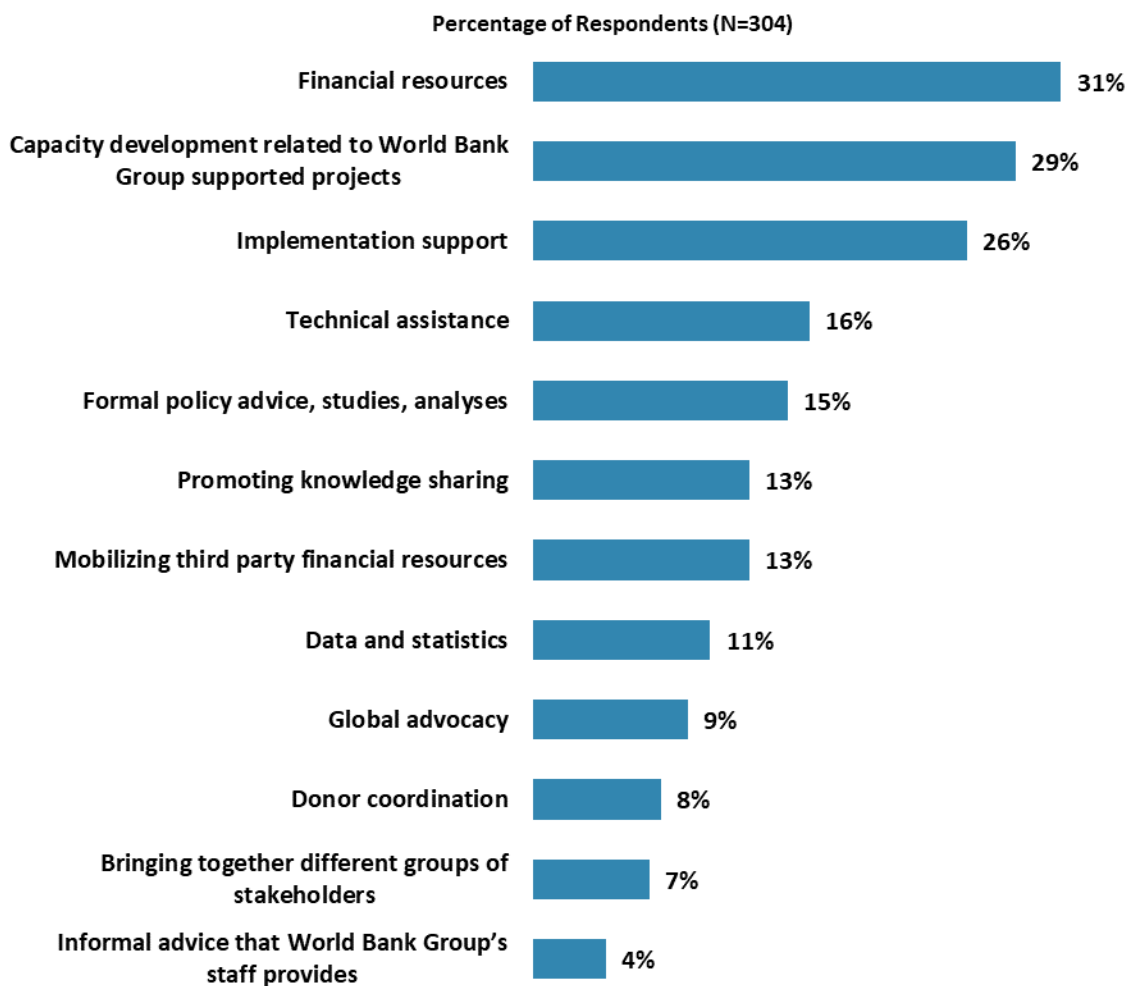
Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Collaboration on a Scale from 1 to 10

Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest values to Mauritania were "*capacity development related to WBG supported projects*" (42%), "*financial resources*" (32%), "*technical assistance*" (22%), "*implementation support*" (22%), and "*policy advice studies, analyses*" (22%).



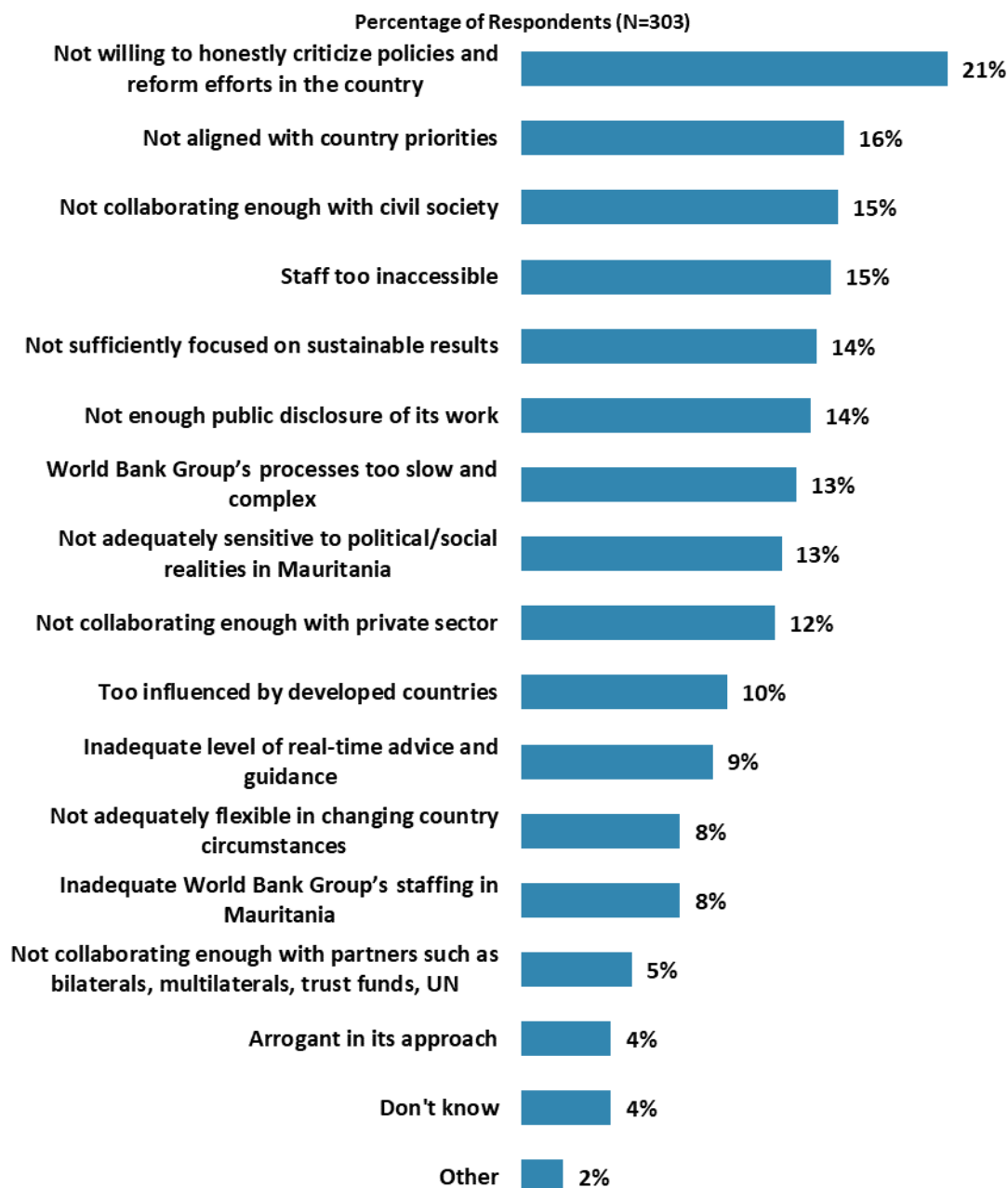

Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses in its work in Mauritania were "*not willing to honestly criticize policies and reform efforts in the country*" (25%), "*not adequately sensitive to political/social realities in Mauritania*" (19%), and "*not collaborating enough with civil society*" (19%). Of note, "*staff too inaccessible*" was much more likely to be selected as a key weakness in the WBG's work in FY '21 (15%) compared to FY '18 (6%).

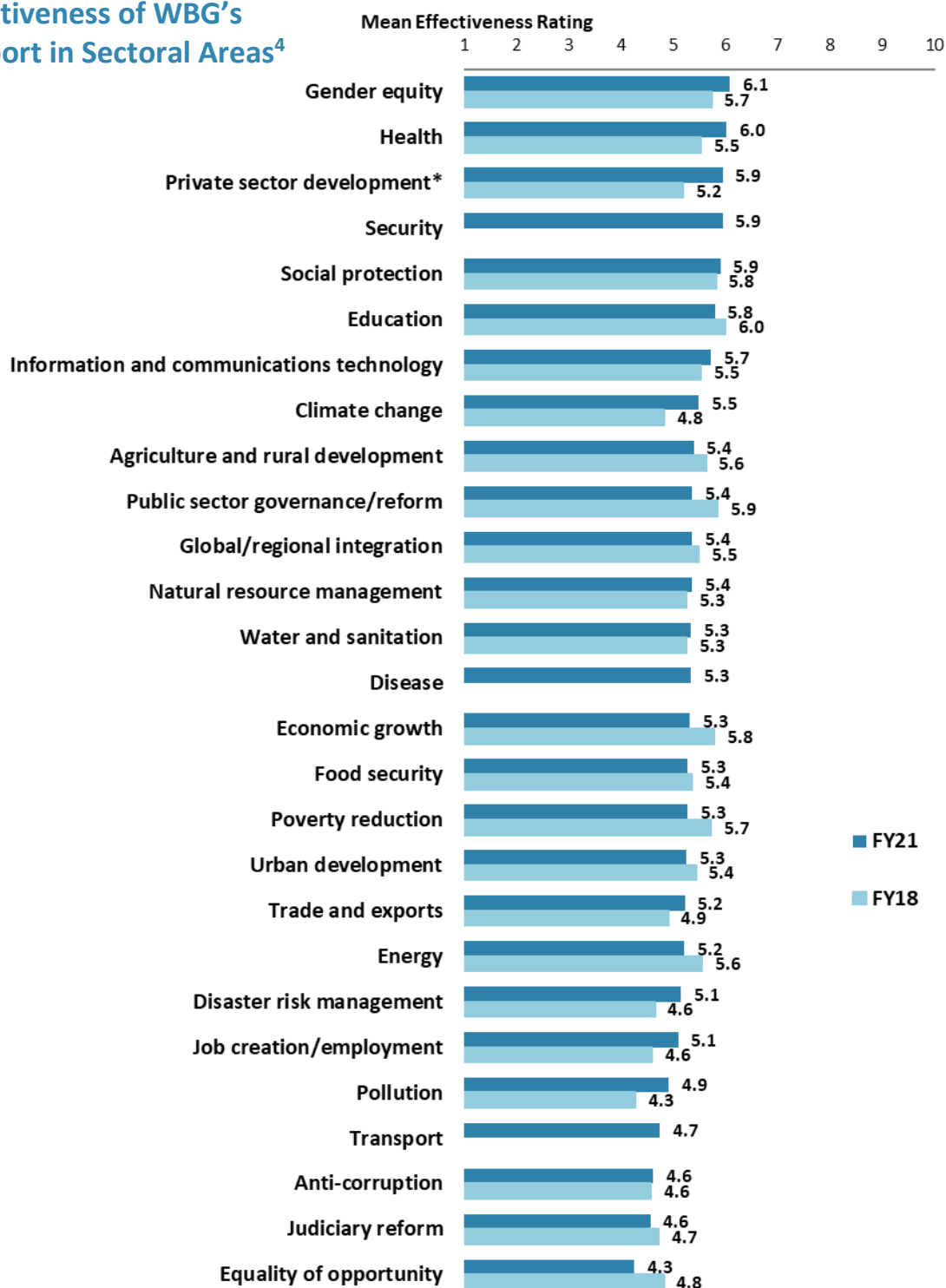

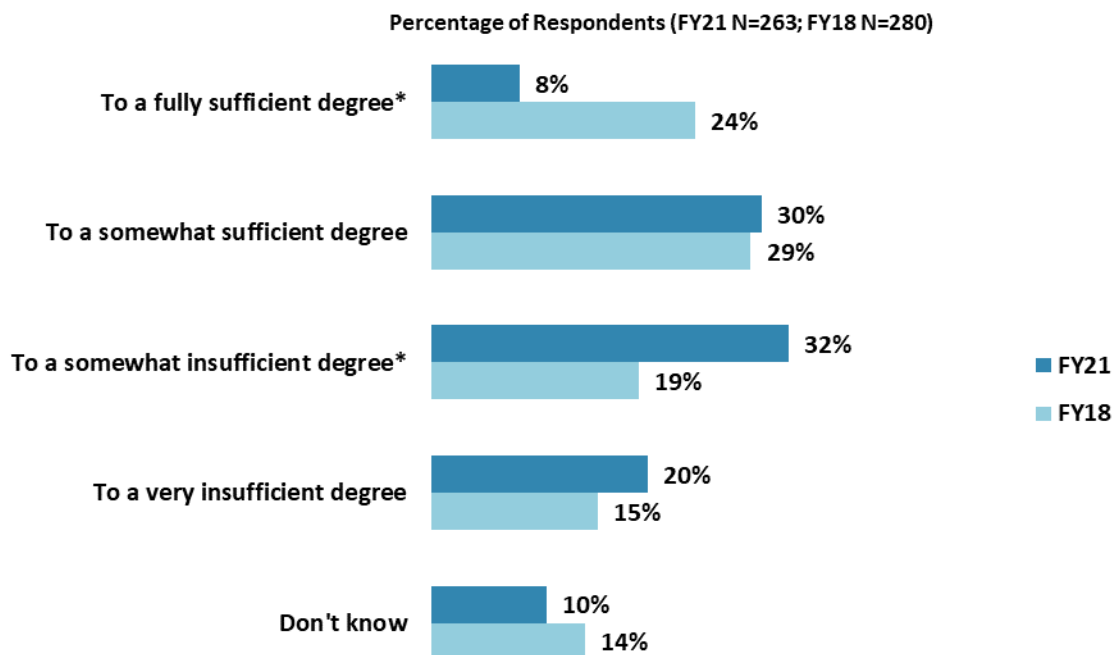

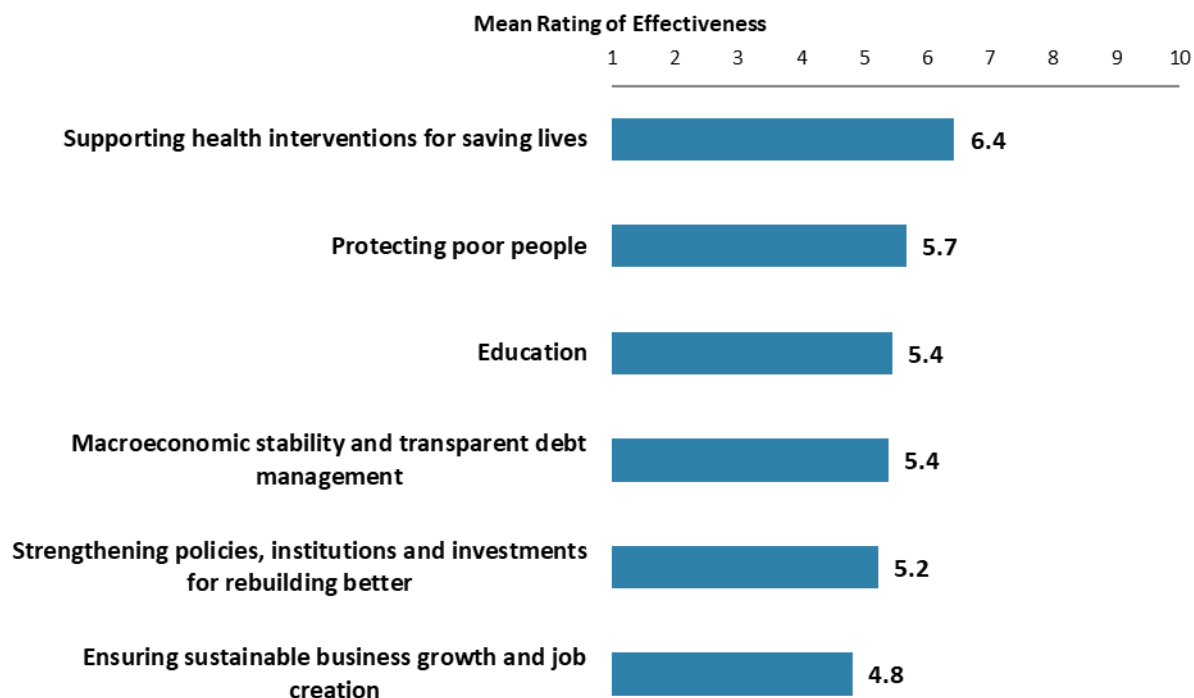
"To what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's work and support help the poorest in Mauritania? (Select only ONE response)" (Respondents chose from a list.)

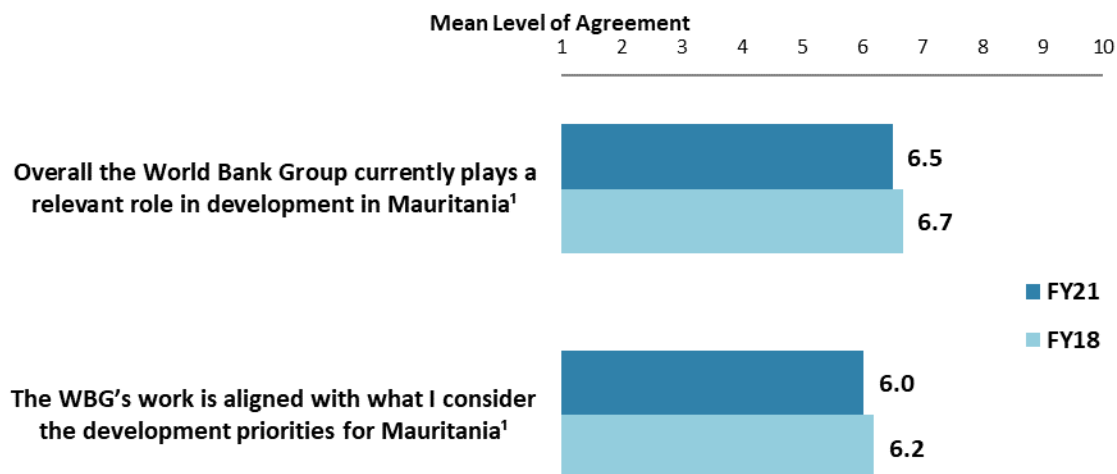

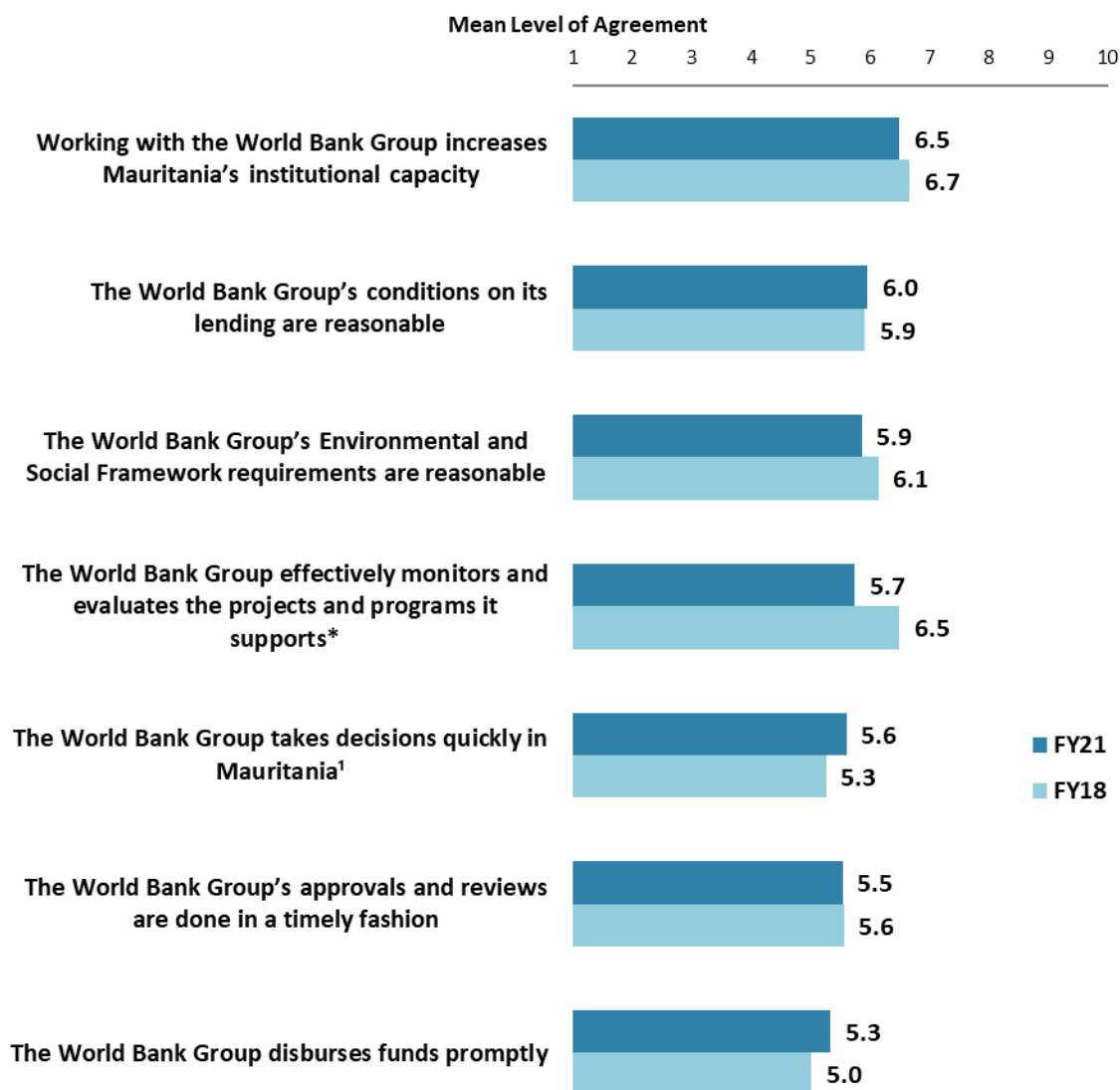


"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements about the World Bank Group's work in Mauritania?" (1-"Strongly disagree", 10-"Strongly agree")

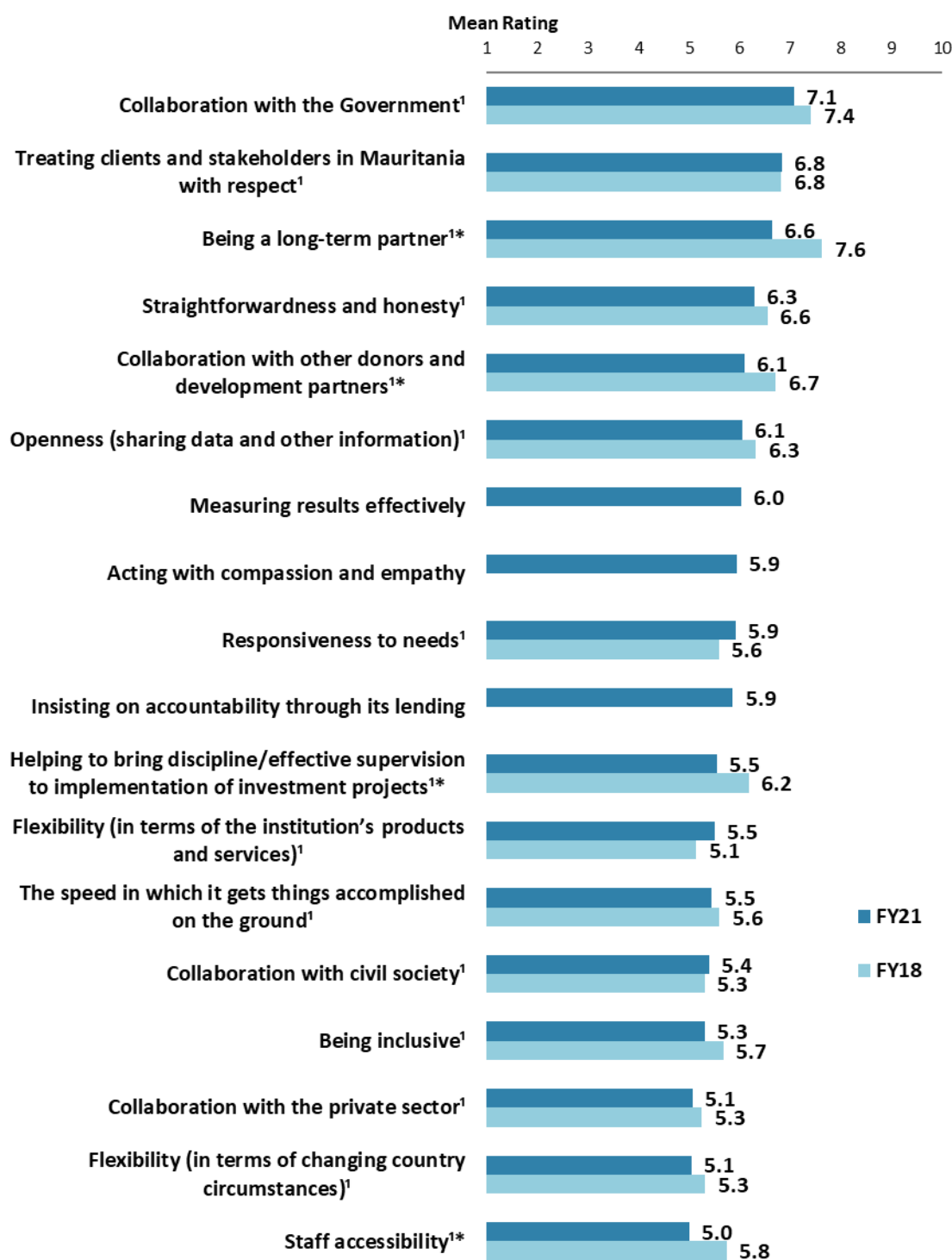
"To what extent do you agree/disagree with the following statements?"

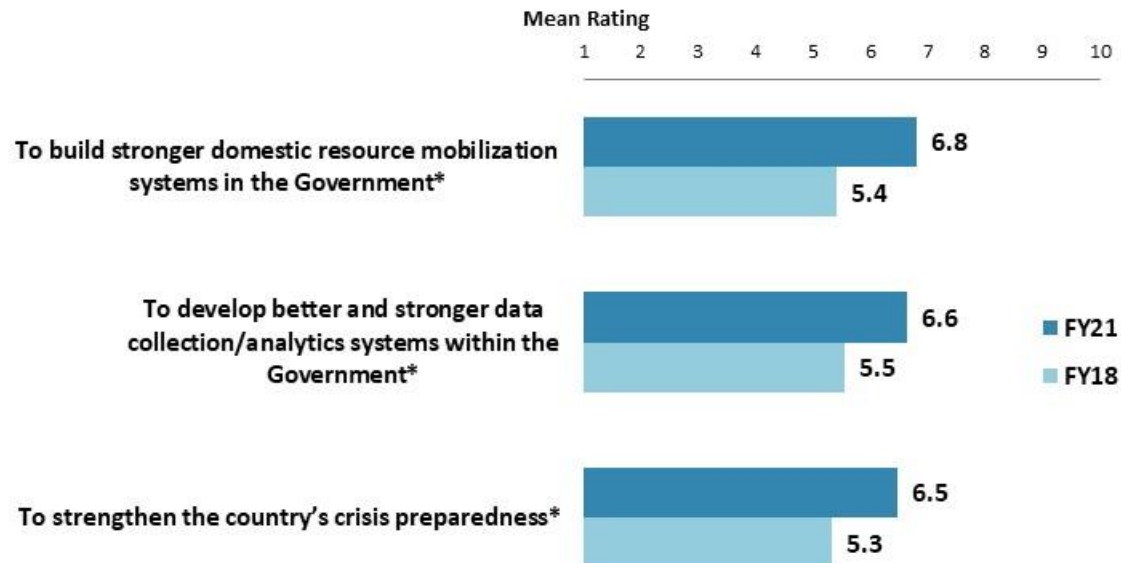


"To what extent is the World Bank Group an effective development partner in Mauritania, in terms of each of the following?" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

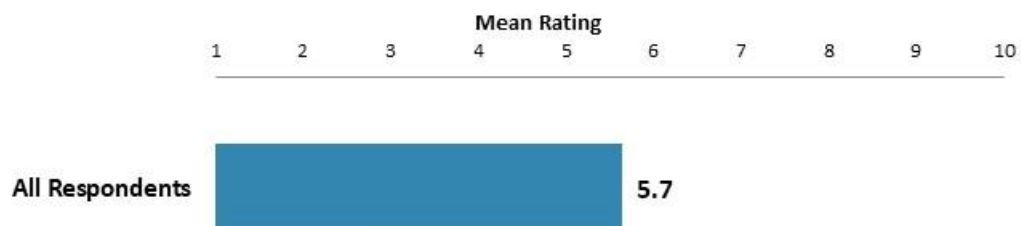


"How effectively does the World Bank Group support Mauritania's efforts ...?"

Donor Community Support for Refugees



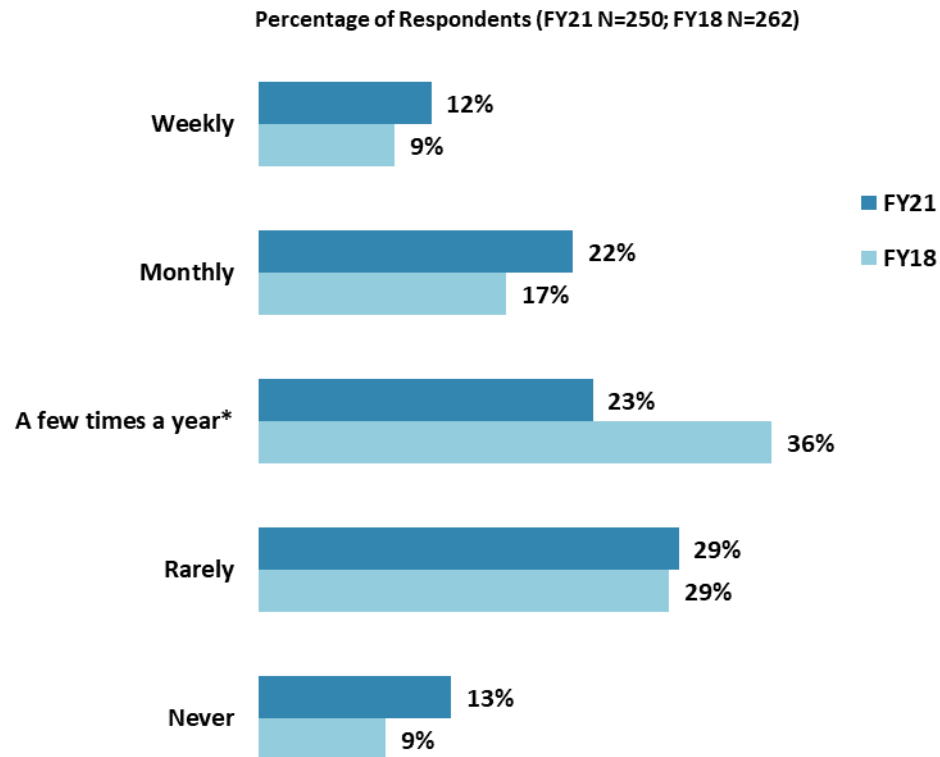
"To what extent do you believe that the donor community is doing enough to support the government's efforts related to refugees in Mauritania?"

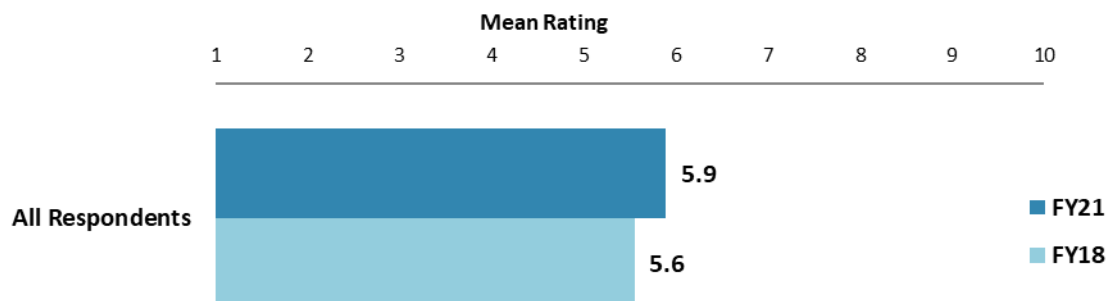

Meeting Mauritania's Knowledge Needs (Indicator Question)

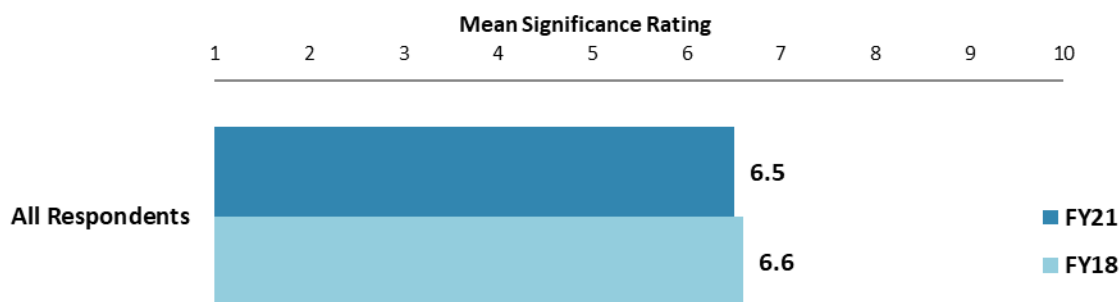

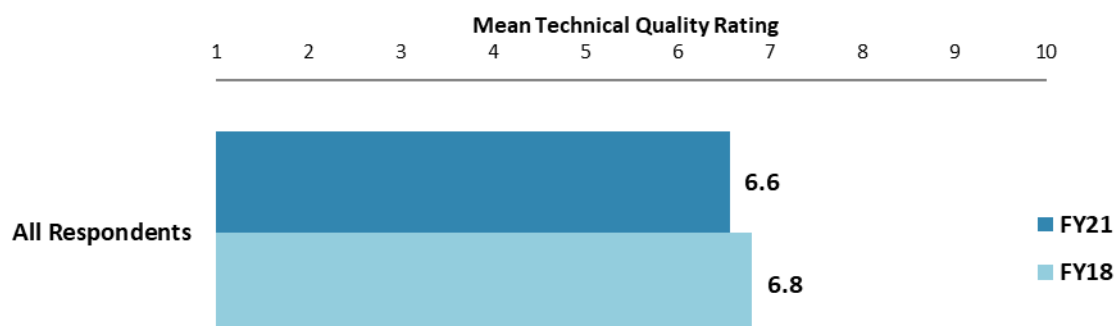
Contribution of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities (*Indicator Question*)

Technical Quality of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities (*Indicator Question*)



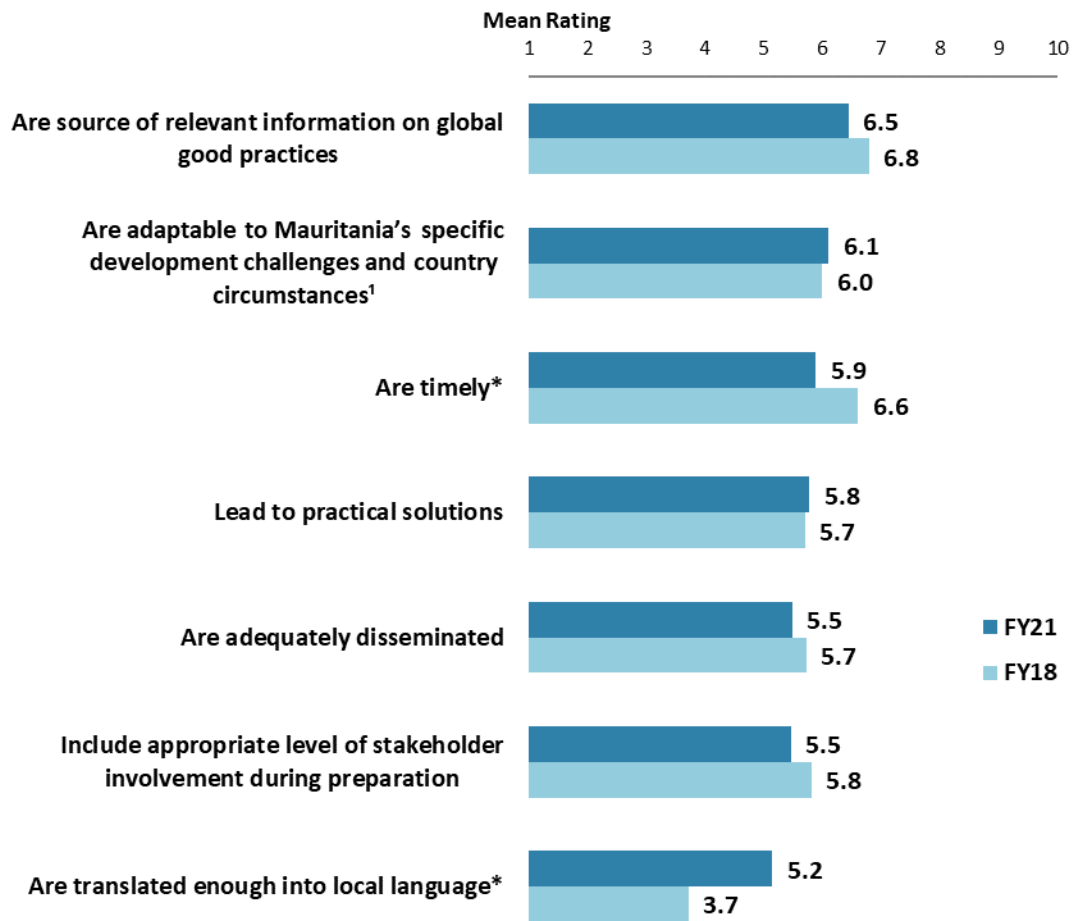

Qualities of the WBG's Knowledge Work and Activities

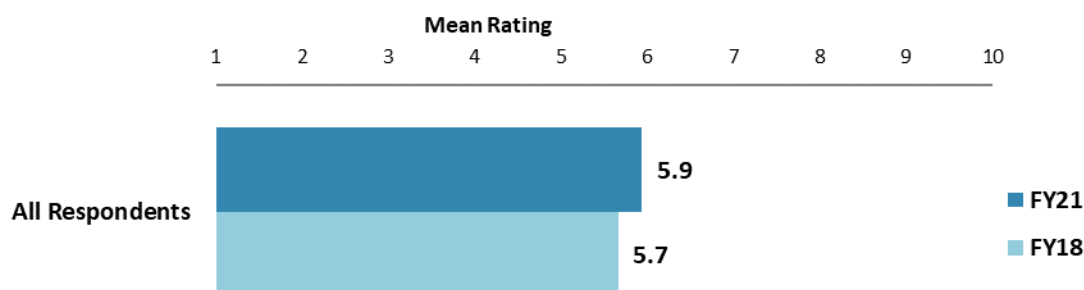


"In Mauritania, to what extent do you believe that the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities:" (1-"To no degree at all", 10-"To a very significant degree")

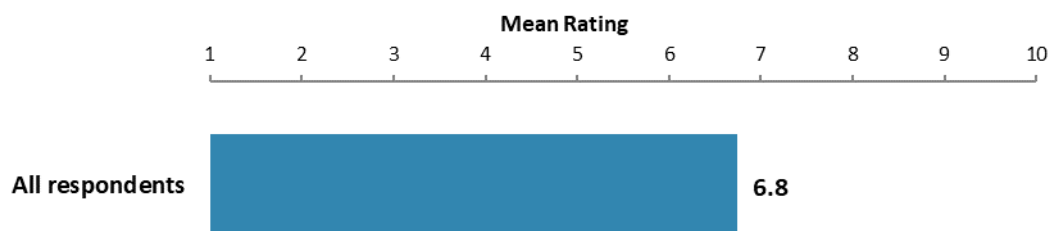

Meeting Mauritania's Needs for Financial Instruments (*Indicator Question*)



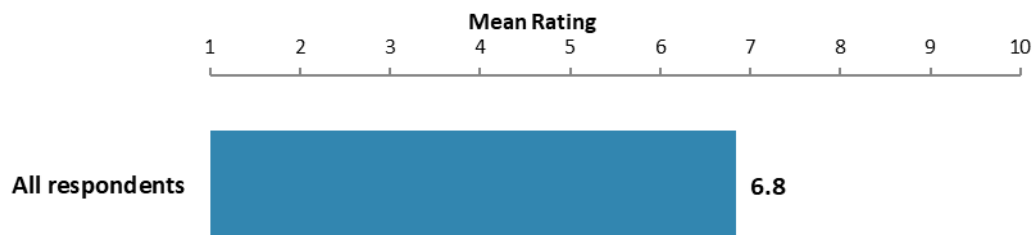
"The World Bank Group's financial instruments meet the needs of Mauritania."

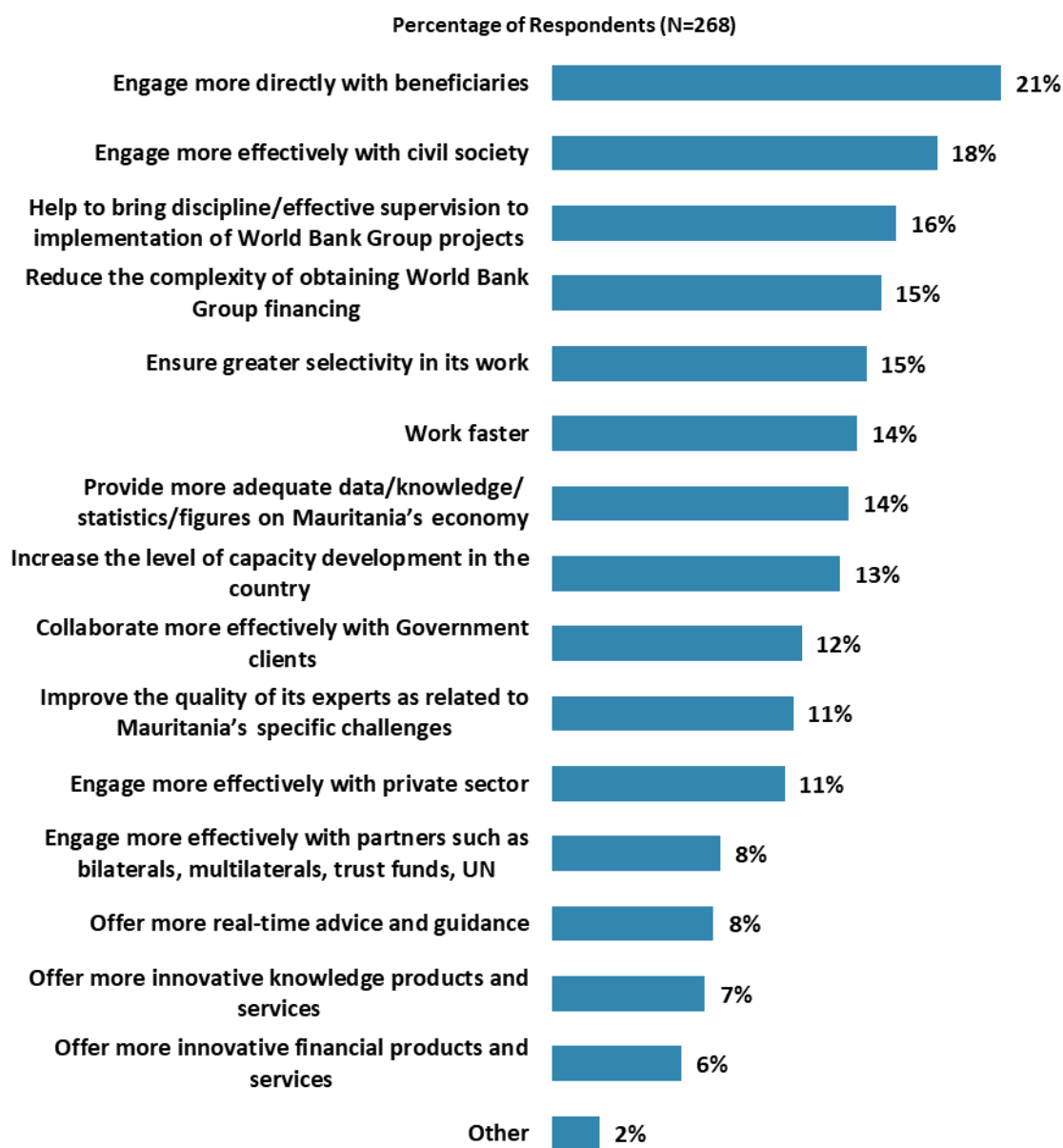

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the FY '18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG should “*work more with civil society and beneficiary representatives*” (38%), “*increase the level of capacity development in the country*” (22%), and “*collaborate more effectively with Government clients*” (20%) to make itself of greater value in Mauritania. Of note, respondents were much more likely to indicate that the WBG should “*ensure greater selectivity in its work*” in FY '21 (15%) compared to respondents in FY '18 (7%)



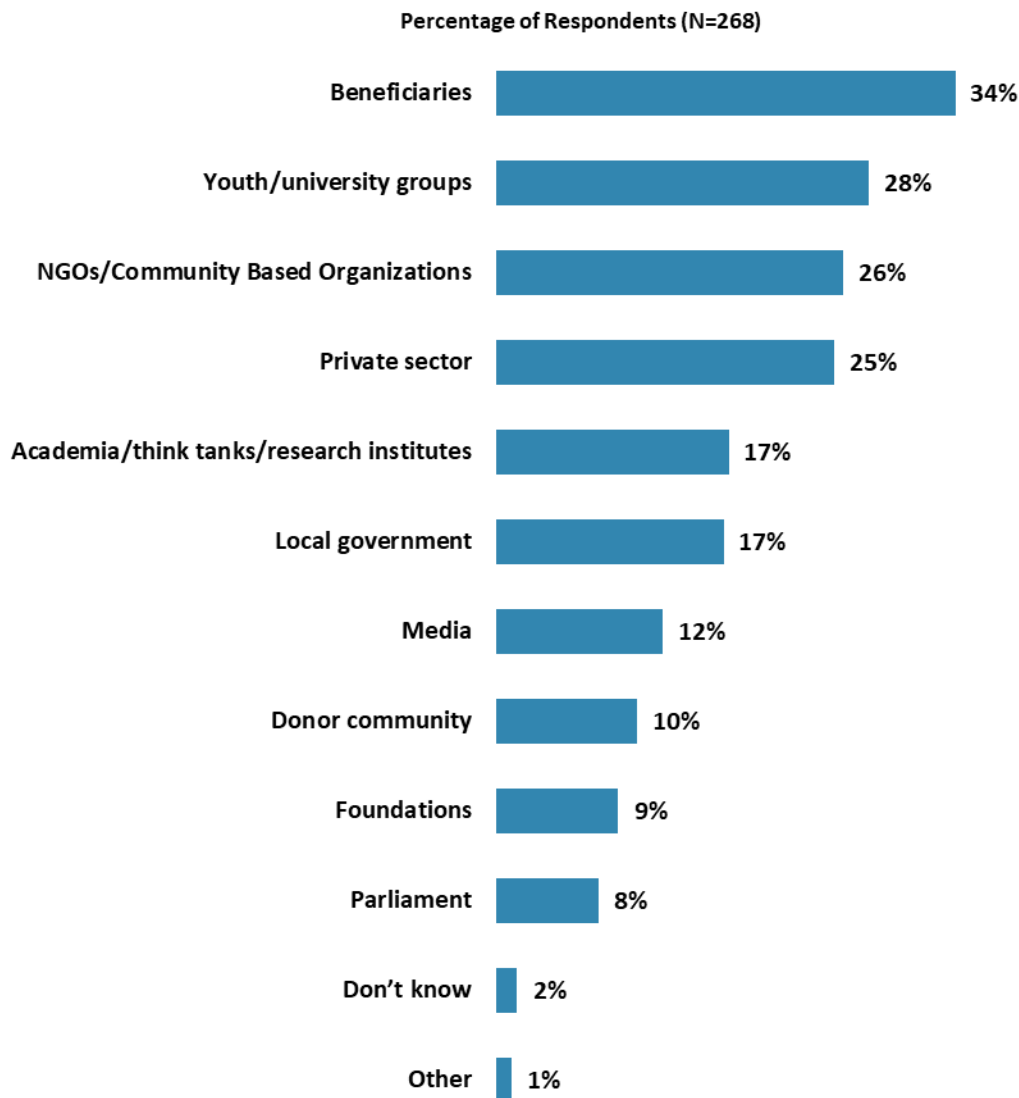

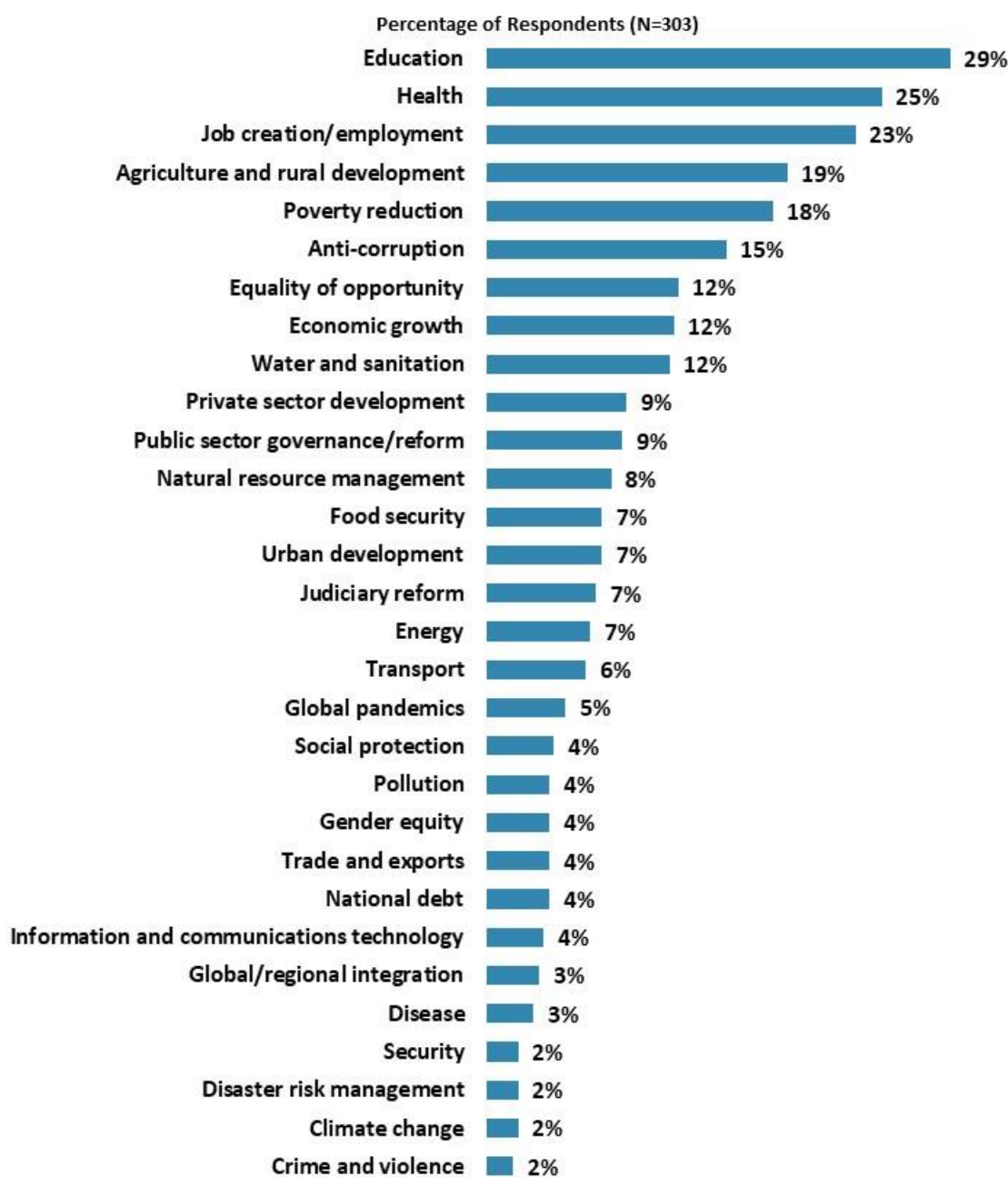

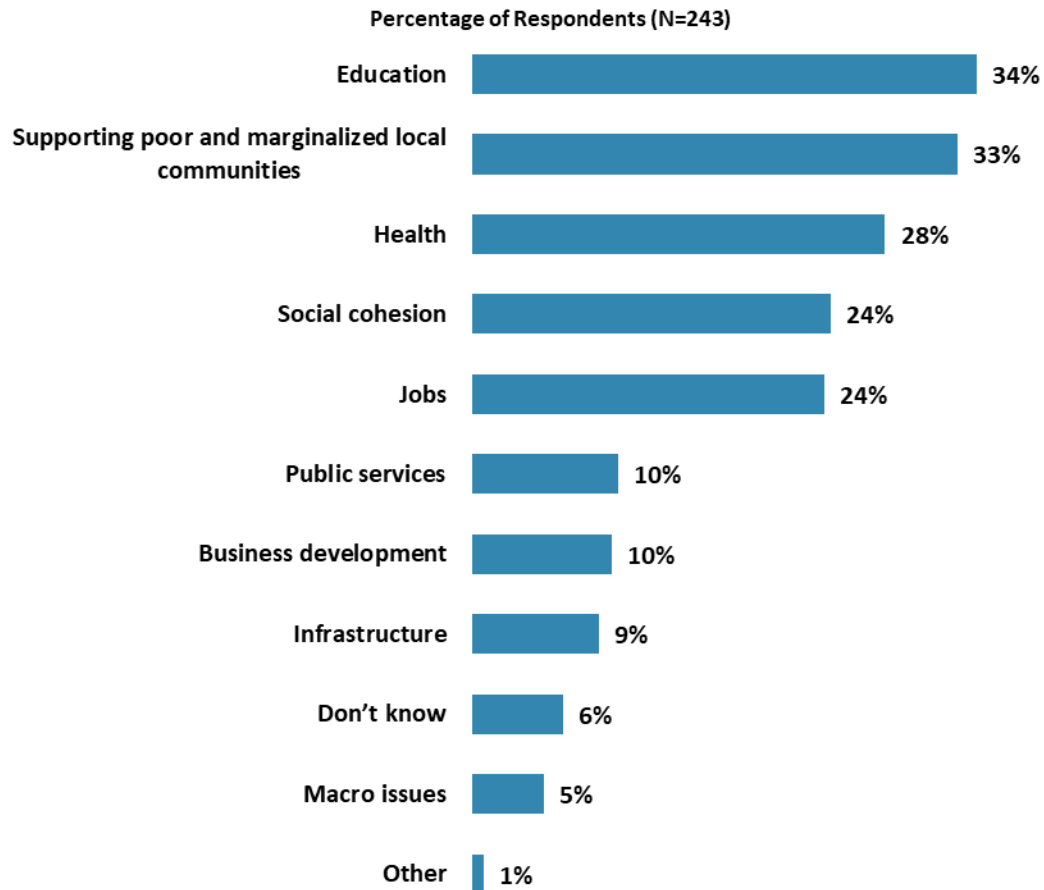

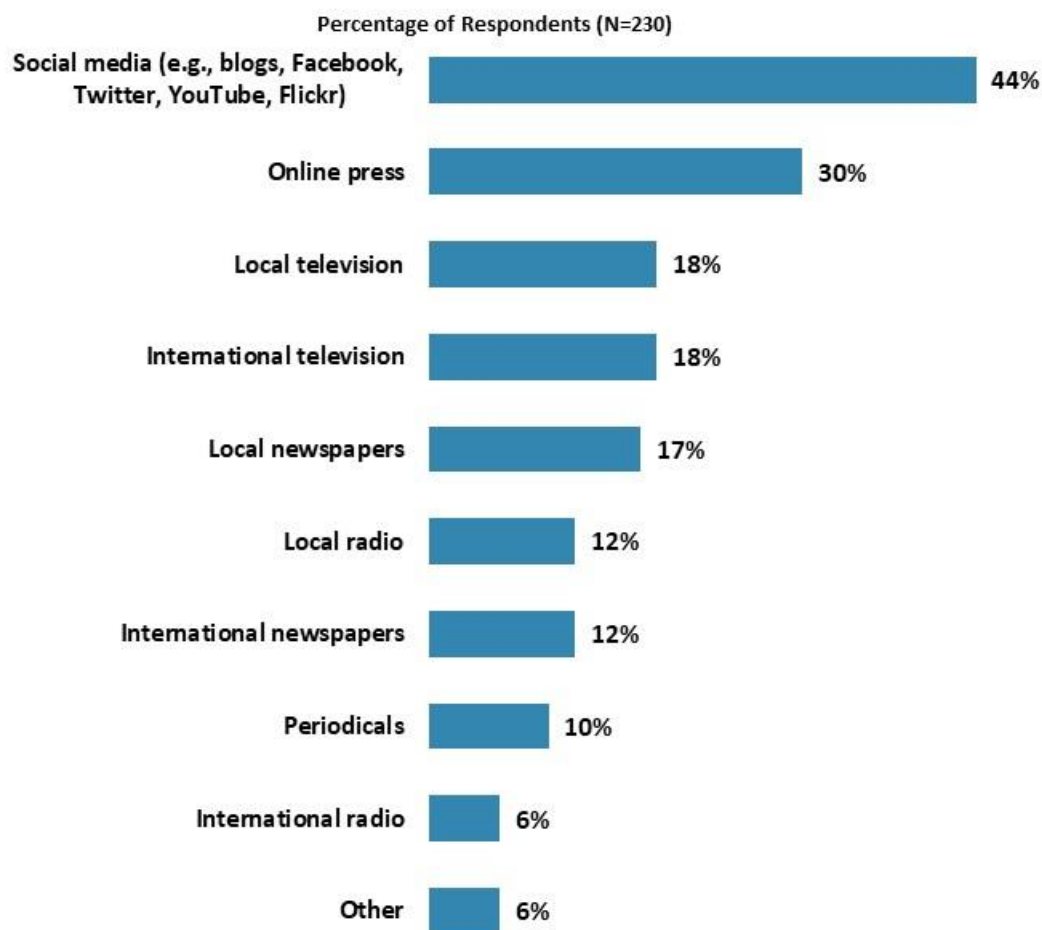

"How do you get most of your information about economic and social development issues in Mauritania? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

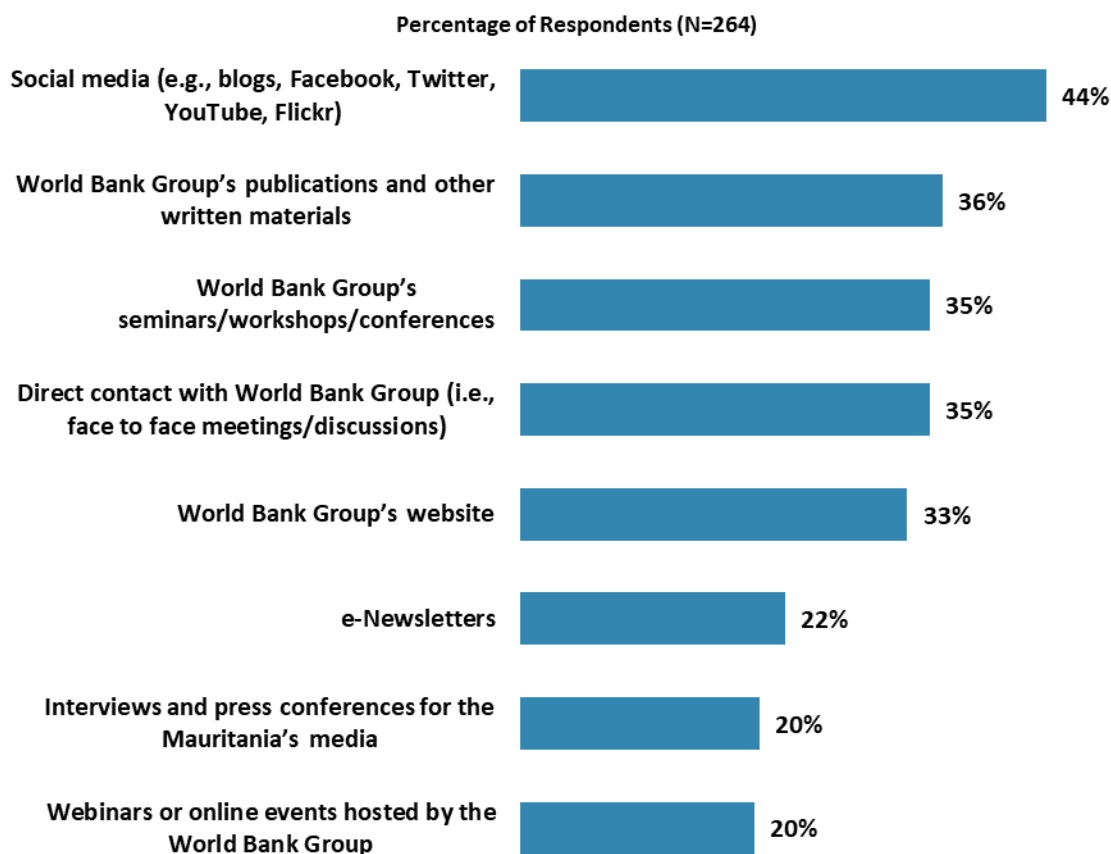

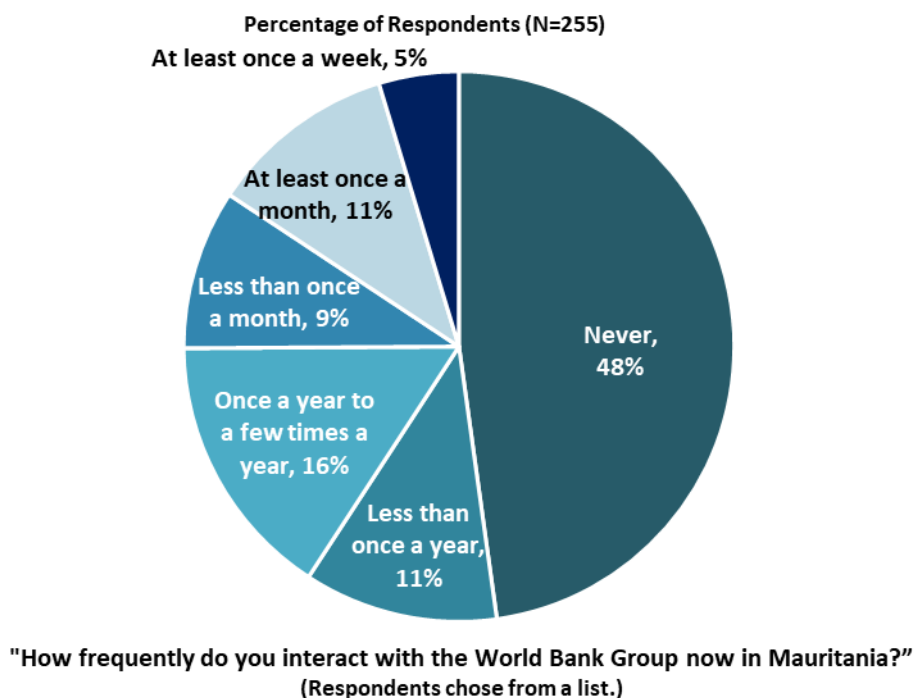


"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group?
(Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)

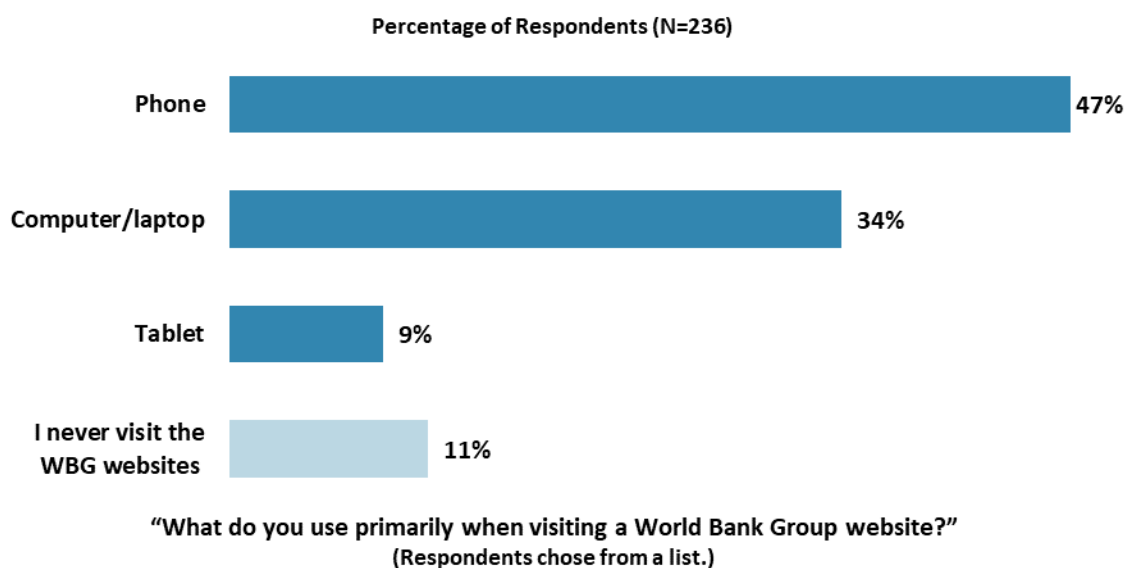

WBG Interaction Frequency



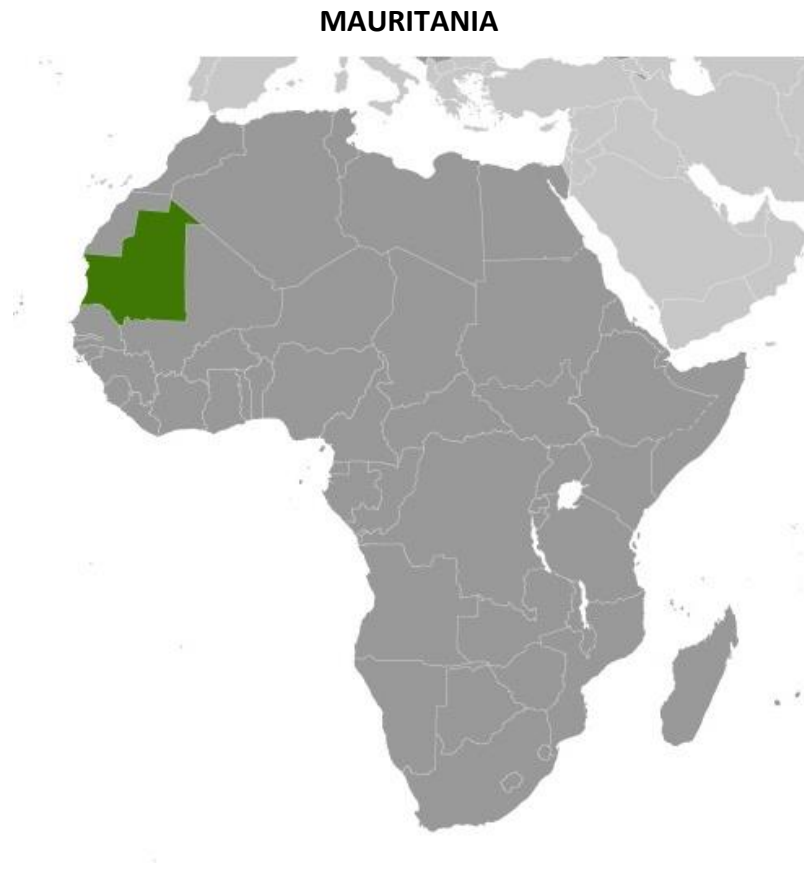
