I. Objectives

This survey was designed to assist the World Bank Group (WBG) in gaining a better understanding of how stakeholders in Benin perceive the WBG. The survey explored:

- *Overall Context*
- *Overall Attitudes toward the World Bank Group*
- *World Bank Group's Work and Engagement on the Ground*
- *World Bank Group's Support in Development Areas*
- *World Bank Group's Knowledge Work and Activities*
- *The Future Role of the World Bank Group in Benin*
- *Communication and Information Sharing*
- *Background Information*

II. Methodology

From April 2021 to May 2021, 651 stakeholders of the WBG in Benin were invited to provide their opinions on the WBG's work in the country by participating in a Country Opinion Survey. Participants were drawn from the Office of the President, Prime Minister; office of a minister; office of a parliamentarian; ministries/ministerial departments/implementation agencies; Project Management Units (PMUs) overseeing implementation of WBG projects; consultants/contractors working on WBG-supported projects/programs; local governments; independent government institutions; the judicial system; state-owned enterprises; bilateral and multilateral agencies; private sector organizations; the financial sector/private banks; private foundations; NGOs and community based organizations; trade unions; faith-based groups; youth groups; academia/research institutes/think tanks; the media; and other organizations.

A total of 464 stakeholders participated in the survey (71% response rate). Respondents completed the questionnaire with a representative from the local fielding agency, received the questionnaire via a courier and returned it accordingly, or they completed the questionnaire online.

Every country that engages in the Country Opinion Survey (COS) must include specific indicator questions that will be aggregated for the World Bank Group's annual Corporate Scorecard. These questions are identified throughout the survey report.

Note that the body of the report presents data on selected questions of the survey questionnaire. Please refer to Appendix A for data on all survey questions. Appendices B and C present data on selected questions. Additional data breakdowns are available upon request.



II. Methodology (continued)

The results in this year's Country Survey were compared to those in the Country Survey conducted in FY'18 (response rate was 65%, N=452). Data were weighted to reach the same stakeholder composition in two years, which allows for year comparisons. Stakeholder groups which were not present in both fiscal years were not included in the comparison. Respondents who belonged to the "other" stakeholder category were not included either. Comparing responses across Country Surveys reflect changes in attitudes over time, but also changes in respondent samples and changes to the survey instrument itself. To reduce the influence of the latter factor, only those questions with similar response scales/options were analyzed. To reduce the influence of the former, the samples from FY'18 and FY'21 were weighted to have equivalent stakeholder groupings, allowing for more statistically reliable comparisons. Due to this weighting, mean ratings, percentages of respondents, and the total number of respondents in both years are slightly different from those of the original data reported in the FY'18 COS report and the non-weighted data presented in this report.




“Which of the following best describes your current position?”

Area of Primary Specialization




“Please identify the primary specialization of your work.”



Exposure to Agencies within the World Bank Group




"Which of the following agencies of the World Bank Group do you primarily collaborate/work with in Benin?"

Familiarity with the World Bank Group

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in this year's Country Survey had significantly higher levels of familiarity with the WBG compared to respondents in the FY'18 Country Survey (weighted mean in FY'21 = 7.0; weighted mean in FY'18 = 5.5)².
- **Impact of familiarity:** Respondents' ratings of familiarity³ with the WBG were significantly, moderately correlated with their ratings for the WBG's overall effectiveness⁴ in Benin, with their ratings that the WBG plays a relevant role in Benin's development, and significantly, strongly correlated with their agreement that the WBG's work helps to achieve development results.





Perceptions of Economic Opportunity




"Do you think that economic opportunity for citizens in Benin is ...?"

Development Priority

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'18 Country Survey indicated that the most important development priorities in Benin were “*education*” (47%), “*public sector governance/reform*” (45%), “*agriculture and rural development*” (32%), “*private sector development*” (23%), and “*energy*” (22%).
- **Specialization:** Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as “*education*” (13% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that “*education*” was the most important development priority in Benin, compared to the rest of the respondents (education specialists = 59%; others = 32%). Similarly, respondents whose primary specialization was “*health, nutrition*” (11% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that “*health, nutrition*” was the most important development priority in Benin (health specialists = 50%; others = 14%).⁵



What Would Contribute Most to Reducing Poverty

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'18 Country Survey indicated that the biggest contributors to poverty reduction in Benin were “*agriculture and rural development*” (61%), “*job creation/employment*” (34%), “*economic growth*” (27%), and “*education*” (27%). Of note, “*transport*” gained in priority in FY '21, with 18% of respondents selecting it compared to just 6% in FY '18.
- **Specialization:** Respondents whose primary specialization was “*health, nutrition*” (11% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that “*health, nutrition*” would contribute the most to poverty reduction in Benin (health specialists = 41%; others = 15%).⁶










"When economic and/or social reform efforts fail or are slow to take place in Benin, which of the following would you attribute this to? (Choose no more than TWO)"



The World Bank Group's Overall Effectiveness⁷ (Indicator Question)




"Overall, please rate your impression of the World Bank Group's effectiveness in Benin." (1-"Not effective at all", 10-"Very effective")

Influence on Benin's Development Agenda (Indicator Question)









Overall Ratings for Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups

- **Collaboration:** Respondents who collaborate with the WBG had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-nine COS indicator questions (mean rating = 7.9) compared to respondents who do not collaborate with the WBG (mean rating = 7.4).

This year's collaborators had significantly higher mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the indicator questions⁸ compared to the collaborators in FY'18 Country Survey (mean rating in FY'18 = 6.6; mean rating in FY'21=7.6).

- **Stakeholder groups:** Respondents who are PMU/Consultant on the WBG's projects had the highest mean ratings for the aggregated responses to the twenty-nine COS indicator questions, whereas respondents from the bilateral agencies/multilateral agencies had significantly lower mean ratings. Responses for individual indicator questions by stakeholder groups can be found in Appendix B (page 59).



Mean Ratings for All Indicator Questions by Stakeholder Groups on a Scale from 1 to 10



Greatest Value

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest values to Benin were “*capacity development related to World Bank Group supported projects*” (56%), “*financial resources*” (36%), “*technical assistance*” (21%), “*mobilizing third party resources*” (19%), and “*implementation support*” (19%).





Greatest Weakness

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG's greatest weaknesses in its work in Benin were “*not willing to honestly criticize policies and reform efforts in the country*” (31%), “*too influenced by developed countries*” (24%), “*WBG's processes too complex*” (18%), and “*not enough public disclosure of its work*” (17%).



Effectiveness of WBG's Support in Sectoral Areas: Year Comparison



Effectiveness of WBG’s Support in Sectoral Areas: Collaboration⁹







Support related to COVID-19 outbreak













Effectiveness of WBG's Support




"How effectively does the World Bank Group support Benin's efforts ... ?"








"Overall, how would you rate the technical quality of the World Bank Group's knowledge work and activities?" (1-"Not significant at all", 10-"Very significant")









- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG should “*work more with civil society and beneficiary representatives*” (26%), “*reduce the complexity of obtaining World Bank Group financing*” (26%), “*collaborate more effectively with Government clients*” (23%), and “*leverage the private sector more*” (21%) to make itself of greater value in Benin.




"Which of the following SHOULD the World Bank Group do to make itself of greater value in Benin? (Choose no more than TWO)"



Where the World Bank Group Should Focus its Resources

- **Year comparison:** Respondents in the previous FY'18 Country Survey indicated that the WBG should focus its resources on “*agriculture and rural development*” (47%), “*education*” (43%), “*energy*” (30%), “*health*” (29%), and “*public sector governance/reform*” (24%).
- **Specialization:** Respondents who identified their primary specialization of work as “*education*” (13% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that the WBG should focus most of its resources on “*education*”, compared to the rest of respondents (education specialists = 67%; others = 29%). Similarly, respondents who identified their primary specialization as “*health, nutrition*” (11% of the sample) were significantly *more* likely to indicate that the WBG should focus most of its resources on “*health, nutrition*” (health specialists = 59%; others = 19%).¹¹



(Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)






"How would you prefer to receive information from the World Bank Group? (Choose no more than TWO)" (Respondents chose from a list. Responses combined.)



"Which Internet connection do you use primarily when visiting a World Bank Group website?" (Respondents chose from a list.)


