

Guide to dataset: Djibouti social safety net midline survey data

The dataset is composed of the weekly modules administered to both the beneficiary woman and her husband during three consecutive weeks while the public works were taking place

Employment Diaries: Employment diaries for the women and for their husbands. The diaries also included modules on labor force participation of other household members, labor and non-labor income.

Intra-household transfers: A module that measured intra-household cash transfers between the respondent and the rest of household members was also administered weekly as part of the diaries to capture contemporaneous income transfers cross household members.

The weekly surveys had also rotating module on time use, household expenditures and food security according to the following timeline of interview.

The data collection was staggered in waves, in line with the staggered rollout of the public works. These are the different groups interviewed at midline at different points in time. with each treatment and control group interviewed as follows:

Each survey wave had survey administered in three consecutive weeks. The data is organized in wide form, with one line per household (the household identifier is id6).

Each variable is coded according to the week of the interview and whether it refers to a woman (f) or her husband (h) questionnaire (for example w1_f36 refers to week 1, female questionnaire, question 36). Whenever the f or h is not specified, it is assumed to be the female/woman questionnaire.
